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

The Red Dress Run has been the signature event of the Hash House Harriers since 1988 and has raised funds for charities across the globe. **www.RedDressRuns.org** works to promote and protect the Hash House Harriers' Red Dress Run tradition. In addition to its website, the RedDressRuns.org network includes a companion **Facebook page** and **Twitter feed**.

ould an event selected as one of the Top Ten Red Dress Runs of 2014 live up to its billing? Organizers of the Red Dress Run preramble in Brussels answered that question with an emphatic yes.

The "Brussels 2014 A Beer Odyssey" Red Dress Run was selected by RedDressRuns.org based upon factors such as support for charity, connecting the Red Dress Run to the Hash House Harriers' brand, good organization, "hashpitality" and other qualities that made it unique.


In order to ensure the highest quality of event, organizers limited registrations to the first 1,000 who signed up. Another 100 participants were allowed to sign up in Brussels the day preceding the Red Dress Run.

One of the aspects that made this Red Dress Run event particularly special was that that co-hares were *Deep Throat* and *Zulu Boy*, both of whom hared the very first Red Dress Run in San Diego in 1988. *Zulu Boy* was also a pivotal player in the <u>August 7, 1987 "hot tub incident"</u> that played a contributing role in launching the Red Dress Run a year later. Also of historical significance, Zulu Boy helped introduce the first Red Dress Run in Europe at the July 1997 Euro Hash pre lube in Brussels. The theme of the 2014 Red Dress Run was an upbeat commemoration of our hash friends who departed to the On After since Cardiff 2004 — sadly including the Lady in Red, who had signed up to attend this event.

As any organizer can tell you, no event ever goes completely according to plan. In the weeks immediately preceding the Red Dress Run, an event in

Brussels having nothing to do with the Hash House Harriers became unruly. Local authorities reacted by permitting the Red Dress Run contingent upon it being strictly a walk, with no running permitted. In the spirit of the late Lady in Red who used to say she preferred to "saunter" at Red Dress Runs, hashers seemed to accept the circumstances cheerfully.

The pack meandered past one Brussels postcard-worthy location to another. A bit of excitement occurred near the end of the trail when the walk briefly did turn into a full-out run when a purse-snatcher mistakenly thought he could outrun the world's largest running club.



Proving once again that Brussels is a beer paradise, organizers provided a special selection available only for Red Dress Run participants, including:

Kriek Boon, an authentic Belgian lambic brewed with fresh cherries

Keizer Karel Robijn Rood, a ruby red ale to match the ruby red dresses

Keizer Karel Goud Blond, a strong blond, just like The Lady in Red.



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The Hasher Hall of Shame Run by More Leggs

ayton, Ohio in the heart of the Midwest of the United States, has many claims to fame. The city once boasted more patents per capita than any other American city. The National Cash Register and the polonium trigger for the atomic bomb were invented in Dayton. Most significantly, it is the "Birthplace of Aviation". Orville and Wilbur Wright (the inventors of the modern airplane) were raised in Dayton and practiced sustained flight in a farm field close to the city. The Air Force Museum in Dayton is well known world-wide as the home of an impressive fleet of aircraft including one of the original Wright flyers, several presidential planes and the stealth bomber.

Dayton is also the home of the Wright ON-ON DH3, a hash that was founded on 6/28/87 by Little Tooter from the Little Rock H3. Dayton runs every other Saturday and on the full moon of each month with the motto of "rain, sleet, snow or heat". The hash tyrant, P-Head, has run over 930 Dayton hashes (out of a total around 1,090. His wife, Catwoman, is recognized as a song meister at several circles throughout the world. Dayton has held several impressive camp outs and in 2002 hosted the USA Nash Hash. Dayton also shares significant runs with the Sin City H4, located in Cincinnati, a city eighty kilometers south. Sin City was founded by Red Hot Chili Pecker and has held 856 hashes. One of Sin City's most enthusiastic hashers, Hot Tub Slut has run 791 and hared 260 times. The Sin City hash runs the opposite Saturdays of Dayton so that area hashes can hash at least once a week. Both the DH3 and the SCH4 follow the tradition of lives hares and shiggy-filled trails. A consequence of those almost two thousand challenging trails is that hashers get hurt. Two such hashers, More Leggs from DH3 and Fourgasm from SCH4 decided to recognize and (dis)honor those who injured themselves severely enough on trail that they required medical attention. Fourgasm originated the Hall of Shame Hash after dislocating and breaking every possible bone in her left ankle at a camp out, thus having to hash for the next 4 months in a wheelchair. She recently broke and dislocated her right wrist hashing before New Years. After twenty-six years of relatively injury-free hashing, More Leggs broke her elbow when she attempted to pirouette across a fallen tree six feet above a frigid February stream.

They became the hares for a combined **Hasher Hall of Shame** hash. They solicited the assistance of Tiny Tool, a DH3 hasher, to sketch a medallion for the front of hash shirts they were designing. The design



Tiny Tool created included an imprint of the hares with their injuries surrounded by words that described other mishaps from trails including sprained, scraped, punctured, torn, cut, broken, twisted, fractured, poisoned (ivy), stabbed etc. The back of the shirt listed the newly honored members. The prominent first name on the list (in larger print) is Hazzaar Shortfellow, an eighty-six year old hasher who had a heart attack and died on a DH3 trail in 2010. Each year, the DH3 runs a memorial hash either at the site of the fatality or at his memorial site. The hash also erected a special foot marker in Hazzaar's memory (made by Paddidle and Little Fister) at the site of Hazzaar's demise.

Twenty-six hashers are proudly recognized as current hall of shamers...or as Cat Woman says "Hall of Famers". Cat Woman made the list for several mishaps including several broken ribs, a twice broken nose, broken sacrum and coccyx, a dislocated shoulder and sprained ankles. P-Head has also twisted his ankle several times. Porkless has the distinction of hashing for fifteen years and requiring two tetanus shots..one for gouging his knee on barbed wire and one for stepping on a metal spike. Barrel Roll, the DH3 ON-Sec (who initially earned his name by falling and rolling down a hill, on his very first run) injured.... Nipple Rash has the distinction of burning himself while fire-jumping at a DH3 camp-out.

Approximately fifty hashers showed up for the **Hasher Hall of Shame** trails. Each was given a "disability" to contend with during the run. Crutches, slings, splints, and even a wheel chair were required to participate in the four mile runner trail/two mile walker trail. The run included several song checks. A new song was created by More Leggs for the hash event, sung to the tune of "The Farmer in the Dell". The simple lyrics include: "The Hasher Hall of Shame, The Hasher Hall

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of Shame, We (They) all are members of the Hasher Hall of Shame". Each honored hasher was invited to sing about their own mishap... "More Leggs broke her elbow, More Leggs broke her elbow...she is a member of the hasher hall of shame".

Will this become an annual event for the DH3 and SCH4? The hares aren't certain yet...maybe they are superstitious....and know competitive half-minds will vie for the honor of making the hall of shame list. Wishing you all fun, injury-free trails.

he Aloha H3 is based on the island of Oahu, Hawaii, and was founded by Ed "Hazukashii" Howell, Scott "Anal Farmer" Sheldon, and Kip "DOT" Carpenter with the first run taking place on 22 Sep 1991. Hazukashii and Anal Farmer met on a Tuesday evening while running a trail with the Honolulu hash in June or July of 1991. Although they enjoyed the easy laid back atmosphere, they reminisced about Asia where they started hashing (Haz on Okinawa in 1984, and Anal Farmer in Seoul in 1989). We agreed that a weekend hash was in order and set about to organize. DOT and Haz had hashed together in Okinawa, so DOT was asked





to join in to help the new club get going. Each of us chipped in \$100 to buy coolers, beer, and snacks for the first trail, and to get T-shirts and headbands made. We also each contributed to the makeup of the hash, Anal Farmer created the original logo, Haz picked the name, and DOT picked the day. The Aloha H3 for the first 4-5 years ran on Sunday afternoon because DOT was a SCUBA instructor and taught classes on Saturday, and certified many of the original hashers, but now the AH3 runs on Saturday. We agreed we would each take a turn at GM for 5 weeks, and then hold open elections once things got rolling, so after drawing straws, DOT had the first 5 weeks, Anal Farmer was next, and Haz got the final 5 weeks, and was subsequently voted in as the first GM for 6 months. The first trail had 25 hashers turn up to run





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trail in Kailua, on the windward side, but after that the numbers hovered around 10-12 for a few months as most people already had established schedules for entertainment, it was Hawaii after all. By the late 90s, the pack had over 100 on a weekly basis, but has had its ups and downs over the years, but still has a steady following with 50 or more hashers each week. During the 90s, the Aloha Hash had away weekends on many of the other Hawaiian Islands, but now other hash clubs have formed on Maui and the Big Island, and now a travel hash, the Volcano H3, sponsors most of the off island hash trips.

Vietnam Nash Hash 2014 Nha Trang

ha Trang Hash is ready for a challenge, and is hosting Vietnam Nash Hash 2014. They have promised to do it with style.





HASHING IN THE PHILIPPINES




4 MAD HASHERS: BLOODY FAIRY. PUSSY LICKER. SINGLE MALT. MEPOLE GOLDEN SHOWER

t 5:00 AM on Tuesday 25th February 2014, 3 hashers from Angeles City and 1 from Subic Bay, Philippines, set off on a historical, never been done before, hike from Barrio Barretto on the West Coast of the Philippines over the Zambales Mountains and ending in Angeles City, some 86

km away. There was no known route between these two places which traverse the breath taking Zambales Mountains and so it was our challenge to go and find one. After three years of on and off

reconnoitring the various stages of the route, we eventually were able to string numerous tracks together into one continuous trail. Large parts of the trail were nothing more than narrow jungle clearings winding up through the dense rain-forest. To even find these we had to enlist the help of the local Aeta mountain people and try and engage them with offers of coffee, cigarettes and a few pesos.

On a typical hot, sweaty and sunny Monday afternoon our elite hiking group met at Dau Bus Terminal, Angeles, and travelled by bus the two hour ride to Subic Bay. After checking in to our overnight digs we headed out to get as much food into us as possible in anticipation of the big calorie spend we were to embark on the following day. A fitful night's sleep was disturbed by our alarms informing us all too soon that it was Tuesday morning and the ungodly hour of 4:00 AM. We each packed




in silence, no doubt all asking ourselves what we were thinking of, and then checked out. A rushed breakfast was quietly enjoyed before we started our hike on head torches in total darkness at 5:00 AM.

It should be noted that going in to the first day, we already knew there was nowhere to pick up supplies on route so we had to carry more than usual. With temperatures above 30 degrees all day and anticipated first day distance of around 50 km, we were each heavily laden with between 6-8 litres of fluid alone. Add to that the fact we knew we were going in to an area where if medical assistance was needed, it would be a very long time before it arrived, so between us we had the best part of all the equipment you'd find in a typical Philippine ER room.


Our initial route was to take us many kilometres up a climb to surmount one of the major ridges in the Zambales range. All this was happening as the sun slowly rose in the clear sky above us, which although beautiful to witness, was not welcome from the unbearable heat we knew it would subject us to. Our aim at this stage was simple, get as far as we can in the relative cool of the early morning before we started to roast. A recce 4 days earlier had identified temperatures in that area reaching 36 degrees Centigrade by 10.30 AM!





We had mentally split the route into sections, which worked well in giving us targets to aim for. Our first real stop was 5 hours and 22 km later at a disused mine site. A scattering of thatch huts and a dirt road made up the local Barangay where we rested for an early lunch. When human endurance is tested, it is small things that make a big difference. A simple cup of hot 3 in 1 coffee gave us all a tremendous mental boost and we were grateful for the caffeine fix. We had some lunch and rested for about half-an-hour before moving on. The next section we knew was the hardest part of the entire route. It comprised a very long steep climb in the hot sun for the next few hours on an uneven single track mountain path. After a couple of hours, with legs screaming out and drenched in sweat we took a 15 minute rest at a lone native hut. The inhabitants, Aeta, were busy cooking what looked very much like a cat over an open fire and made us most welcome. Light cramps were starting to affect one of the group but nothing a bit of stretching could not sort out. Then it was onwards and upwards again for a few more hours until we arrived at another village, Batiawan, at around 4:30 PM. We had now been hiking in difficult and hilly terrain for almost 12 hours and were all shattered. I should mention at this point that 3 of the group are 66 years of age with one young whipper-snapper of 40.

Having anticipated that we'd have consumed the numerous litres of fresh water that we each carried by this time and since no fresh water is available in these remote villages, we were met there by a small support group comprising our wives/girlfriends. This being the first village that we came to that was accessible by road. We rested and enjoyed their company for an hour and a half after which time they departed for Angeles in their jeepney and we continued our hike in the dark, albeit with the aid of headlamps (a disadvantage of these devices is that they give a clear view of the swarms of insects they attract as they fly into your eyes, nose and mouth).

The River and Night

We continued hiking until 9:00 PM by which time we had covered 50 km in total for the day and needed to cross a river that was both wide and deep. Deciding that this wasn't a good idea in the dark we chose instead to sleep overnight in a large field adjacent to the river. We purposely hadn't taken tents (too heavy) but did have lightweight roll mats and ponchos/sheets. We were awakened around 2:00 AM by rain falling on us, just typical considering this was the height of dry season and it



hadn't rained for months. After a couple more hours of trying to ignore the rain and get some more much needed sleep, we decided to think about getting going. It was around 5.00 AM and we were all startled to suddenly spot a rather strange looking native standing over us who seemed bemused at finding four foreigners sleeping in the field in which he was tending his carabaos. We pacified him with the gift of a T shirt that one of our party was done with. It was still pitch dark so we rested another hour and then started preparing for our second day, eventually starting hiking again around 6:00 AM. We had decided weeks earlier that in order to save time due to the number of river crossings we faced on Day 2, it would be quickest to put large plastic bags used for carrying ice over our feet. On the main part this proved successful but after 3 such crossings, some of the bags let themselves down.

The Second Day and Salvation

For the second day we were blessed with overcast skies, light rain and much flatter terrain than we'd experienced on our first day. But countering that was the fact that we were all suffering some degree of fatigue and two of our party had very bad blistering on their feet, which made walking very painful. Never the less, we pressed on, no one giving







voice to their discomfort and were able to maintain a good average speed. After 3 hours we stopped at one of our target points for breakfast, by this stage it was basics such as crackers and beans. Onwards we trod through mainly farmland and dirt tracks. Two more river crossings were made, one through an enormous industrial cement works, which we hurried through for fear of being turned back for trespassing on private land. Our final stop before Angeles had us taking in another welcome cup of hot coffee at a local sari-sari store, how wonderful it tasted. After a final section of 15 km we stumbled, exhausted and grateful to have finished the hike into our finishing point 'The Blue Boar Inn' in Angeles.

Arrival and Celebration, Hash Style

Our hike had covered a total of 87 km with maximum changes in elevation of 1680 m, which we had completed in a total of 34.5 hours and of which around 20 hours were actual walking time. Having arrived back in Angeles in the middle of the afternoon on the second day we did what every good Hasher does, went home, got cleaned up and went out for some beers to celebrate our achievement.




The Hash Darwin Awards

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
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
