



PAN AFRICA HASH 2015 MOVED TO MALINDI, KENYA

HHHi All,

The Pan Africa Hash 2015 event was postponed from Sierra Leone due to unavoidable circumstances and after going back to the bids presented in Ghana, Kenya was awarded the chance to host the event.

Subsequently, Nairobi was planning to celebrate its 2000th Anniversary run at the end of July. It was then deemed appropriate to combine the two events. The Mismanagement assisted by previous NH3 event organizers and GM's started putting up this event together since January. We now have our website up and running www.panafricahash2015.co.ke and urge everyone to register for the event online.



The most suitable venue agreed upon for the Pan Africa Hash 2015 event will be in a small town at the Kenyan Coast known as "Malindi" which lies at the centre of a strip of idyllic tropical beaches offering the visitor a range of world class resorts and quiet relaxing hideaways. Further south, the sleepy village of Watamu is fronted by wide white beaches and activities for divers and snorkelers alike.

Northwest of Malindi is the spectacular Marafa Depression, locally known as Nyari and popularly known as Hell's Kitchen. An extensive series of sandstone gorges and sheer gullies, this unique and other worldly landscape has become part of local folklore where some of our beautiful planned trails will be during the Pan Africa Hash 2015. The thick jungles of the Arabuko Sokoke Forest reserve hide a world of wonders. In the cool of the forest winding paths will take you in search of rare endemic birds and mammals, and visiting herds of Elephant and again some enticing running trails have been established there.

We plan to have our charity "Red Dress" run right in the historical town of Malindi which is one of few towns in Kenya with a rich historical past dating back to the 14th Century, thanks to its role for many centuries as an important trading post on the East African coast . The Red Dress Run starting at the Coral Keys Hotel will showcase this heritage, starting with the iconic Vasco Da Gamma Pillar built in 1499 at the height of Portuguese influence on the town. Another landmark to watch out for on the trail is the Portuguese Church built in the 16th century believed to be the first Christian Church in East Africa.

Along the way will be the Malindi Museum, built in the 19th Century. An interesting place we'll be filling past is Malindi old Town with ancient Swahili and Arabic houses and the unique fishing Pier where local fishermen boast and display their catch of the day.

On the question of security, the Kenyan Government has assured its citizens and visitors that all efforts are being made to keep everyone safe. Nairobi HHH has also taken the best measures to ensure that we shall have a safe event with ample security.

To make this a truly Pan African event, we urge you to assist us in marketing at your Kennel and on your website, Facebook page and verbally at your Hash gatherings. All details about the event are on our website. Kindly ask wankers to come support this event and best of all, join us in celebrating our 2000th Anniversary run.

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Trails n Tales Baang Kokk

Dateline: Bangkok, Thailand

"One night in Bangkok makes a hard man humble"...or so says the song, and running with the Bangkok Hash House Harriers run can be both hard and somewhat humbling as well. Tropical temperatures in the high 90s takes a toll on locals and visitors coming out of more moderate climates. With nearly 100% humidity, you start sweating from the moment you step outside or your abode. And if you're not sweating, you might be in trouble from heat stroke or dehydration.

I'd not run with Thailand's oldest hash for over a year, so it felt good to be back with the old boys at Bangkok's oldest hash. Founded in 1977, the average age of the Bangkok hashers must be approaching middle sixties, so I felt right at home.



The Bangkok Hash is similar to other all-male kennels, which can be found in capital cities throughout Asia. These were the first HHH clubs, spawned from "Mother Hash" when hashing started to spread outward from Kuala Lumpur where the Hash was founded in 1938. Mixed clubs, Harriettes and childrens' clubs followed

the male HHH clubs, many which are still active today. While male HHH clubs are common in Asia, they are a rarity in other parts of the world.

The hare had selected a meeting place off the expressway 10 km out of town at a Gai Yang (BBQ Chicken) Restaurant. After plunking down a 300 baht run fee, I headed down the road with the pack of 30 runners and walkers, and into the rice paddies. We ran thru the paddies, along klongs and through herds of goats and cattle for about 10 Km before arriving back at the parking lot where we were met with bottles of ice-cold beer, and some tasty snacks before the circle.

The circle lasted about 40 minutes with usual welcome backs, interrogating of visitors, commentaries about the trail, and singing the only song the Bangkok hash ever sings..."Here's to the (hare, returner, visitor, etc.) he's so blue, he's a hasher true and true, he's a piss pot so they say, tried to go to heaven, but he went the other way, followed

by a chorus of "Why was he born so beautiful?" One visitor when called upon to sing mistakenly offered a different song and was duly chastised for exhibiting behavior typical of other lesser hashes, but certainly not acceptable at the Bangkok Hash.


While the Bangkok Hash is an all male kennal, there is one notable female who shows up every week. She is Kuhn Daeng, who provides ice cold beer and snacks for the thirsty hounds when they return from the trail. Outstation "open" runs are another opportunity for females to join the Bangkok Hash in a neighboring province or country. A recent outstation in Laos attracted 40 Bangkok hashers with their wives, children, or girlfriends.

Bangkok is home to seven HHH kennels, and 30-40 HHH clubs can be found in Thailand. Renown for its exotic culture, world class cuisine, beautiful beaches, and notorious nightlife, it is no wonder Thailand is called the Land of Smiles.









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Paradose en on Trail with the Aloha H3

or tourists, Hawaii is synonymous with "Paradise" and deservedly so. The islands are blessed with a consistently warm, tropical climate all year long. For Hashers, the word "Paradise" can equally be applied to Hawaii, not for its nice weather (though a definite plus) but for its diverse landscapes and topography. Oahu encompasses 600 square miles, or roughly half the same land mass as Dallas-Fort Worth, Texas. But if one goes hashing in the Dallas area, odds are hard pressed to find anything but dry, flat scrub land or city sidewalk. By contrast, hashers on Oahu traverse a variety of terrain and trail options week to week.





Contrary to popular belief, Oahu is not just lush, tropical rainforest. Shiggy takes on many forms as hashers run through eight distinct climate zones. Starting low at sea level, wankers may traverse rocky or sandy coastline and then trudge through wet, primeval jungle or thick groves of palm and bamboo. Along the central plane and river valleys, ten foot tall elephant and razor grass give new meaning to the word pain. In the more temperate regions, one finds deciduous strawberry guava, ironwood, koa and rainbow eucalyptus trees. Along the North Shore, hashers tread through alpine-like coniferous woods and pad along softened trails blanketed by pine needles. And within the arid rain shadow of the leeward side, shiggy socks are a must as it's not uncommon to be stuck by patches of thorny cactus and jagged lava rock. One thing that all Oahu trails do have in common is they all inevitably go up. Two towering mountain ranges, the Waianae and Ko'olau, rise 3,100 feet and sport literally hundreds of ridge, gulch and steep contour trails to get your heart pounding from both exertion and fear! Dormant volcanic calderas and craters, bitten and carved by thousands of years of rain and wind, make hiking the Leeward and Windward chains an incredible visual treat and physical test. It's not a coincidence Hollywood chose Hawaii to film "Jurassic Park" and "Lost" because at times you feel you're in another world. Speaking of mountains and rain, nowhere will you find more waterfalls and natural swimming holes than on Oahu. Each valley has its own mountain stream and depending on the time of year, it's not a matter of "if" but "how many" pools, cascades and waterfalls hashers will encounter. Beer checks and waterfalls are synonymous and hares must often shoo the pack back on trail because no one wants to leave their beer check.

Another reason why Hawaii hashing is akin to paradise is there are no deadly animals to worry about when scouting trail. Hawaii is devoid of snakes and there are no hungry carnivores to maul or eat you. Places like Alaska certainly must have some beautiful trails but in Hawaii no one prepares or thinks to run into a polar bear or pack of wolves. Wild pigs are the only critters to look out for and because of Hawaii's thriving and delicious kalua pig industry, they are more afraid of us than we of them.

Oahu is also speckled with the relics of the past. Both its military and agricultural history give trails added flavor and fun. WWII era pill boxes and lookout towers strategically perched high on mountain tops make for excellent beer checks and visual delights. Abandoned irrigation and farming structures like tunnels, pipes, dams and reservoirs are exciting features to discover, explore and lead the pack through.

Many Aloha trails are not tech-friendly though hashers must routinely cross, wade or swim though streams, rivers and canals. Super Eagles were once asked to swim to neighboring islets and one trail had off-shore underwater beer checks manned by scuba divers. Inflatable flotation devices are often required and due to Hawaii's unpredictable and sudden downpours, flash flooding is always a possibility. But no one can neglect the fact that Oahu has 220 miles of coastline that make Beach circles a fantastic religious experience. Hashers share the beach with monk seals and sea turtles as they dip in the ocean to clean off their mud, sweat and tears.

Convinced yet? Oahu boasts the Aloha H3, Honolulu, Full Moon, Pick Up and the HO Hash kennels (and we can't forget our friends on the Big Island- Kona and Hilo groups) all who offer trails that take visitors and locals alike to the secret gems of this diverse island paradise.

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

He stated he's very excited to be working with half-minds and gave us a sneak preview of the label. We tasted 6 beers, mostly ales with similar grapefruit undertones, a red, and an peculiar strong ale called LSD (Lompoc Special Draft) 6.9% ABV. We were feeling a bit hazing after that, so we inhaled some pub grub on Just Jerrys tab and off we went.


HASHING IN



coming together to give a great welcome to the 820 registered hashers when they arrive for the weekend of 17th–19th July. The weather may be well be over 30°C with occasional thunderstorms. So bring sunscreen and drink loads of water, or loads of beer!

There are fifteen trails on Saturday. They all include fields, woods, rivers, castles and damsels in distress. The trails are all fairly close to Krakow with the average bus journey of no more than an hour. Most of the trails are located in the fairytale setting known as the 'Castles Trail,' a long valley full of woods and old forts and castles running Northwest from Krakow to Katowice. After Genghis Khan's visit, many were, of course, rebuilt in stone rather than wood.

WESSEX HHH: The Hills Are Alight with the Sound of 'On On': A R*n through upper Jurassic limestone and there are numerous rocks, called outliers towering like castles over the trail. The trails meander through thick forest and meandering shady river



valleys. Plenty of wildlife, including the hash, can be seen enjoying this natural habitat. There is even an 'icecream' stop where the two trails split.

WARSAW and ROYAL KRAKOW

HHH: The trail is set in a beautiful National Park, with castles, caves, rocky outcrops, gorges and all about are pine forests. There is plenty of shiggy for the serious hashers and gentler terrain for the not-so-serious hashers.

We have a tower, beautiful woods, natural rock structures, 'our desert', a swamp, sand and lots more!

A Hardy trail around Krakow Zoo.... An enchanting trail to entertain you! Lots of things for you to explore... You'll even hear the lions roar! Elephants, lions, Hashers too... Which one belongs in Krakow Zoo? Should you survive this fearsome trail.. for you awaits our finest ale! A Challenging or gentle pace... It's up to you, it's not a race!! Follow the flour to a watery food beer stop and hook yourself a beer. Then on to the Tyskie brewery, an amazing brewery founded over 400 hundred years ago that has virtual and live beer!! HURSLEY HHH: THE POLISH JEWELS

14th Century Tenzcynek Castle at Rudno, belonging to the Descendants of the Knights of Malopolska, was ransacked 360 years ago in the hunt for the Polish crown jewels. Hashers, eh! Run is A to B. Terrain is mainly flat with two optional hills at each end of the trail.

A Ramble with the 'wow' factor takes you through the woods north of Zamek and ends up at Gorze Birow Fort, a mediaeval wooden palisaded castle from which you take in the scenic

views around the countryside with a fabulous sight of the Ogrodzieniec Castle, which is the most impressive of the Eagles Nest Castles in the Jura Highlands. We guarantee that you will go, 'Wow,' when we come over the hill and find that the castle awaits us.

RED DRESS R*N: Thursday 16 July

This trail will be a saunter through the city of Krakow, giving tourists many opportunities to see that the correct colour dress code for Poland is in accordance with their flag. Plenty of opportunities to short cut, have a beer, pose for photos and exchange pleasantries with the local police. The Red Dress R*n will put Krakow in your pocket ... so you can put your hands round a cold beer. The Lady In Red who started the RDR family came from Krakow, so on this is one occasion, we will be taking the event 'home'.

KRAKOW BASH: Friday Morning, 17 July

A Bash is a hash on a bike! The long trail is 26km. Dr. Flatus will lead you into the forest to the "Nazi Hotel" for a beer stop, along the river to Tyniec Monastery for a second beer stop and then back toward town along river to Kazimierz. There are shortcuts available for the Turkeys. There is 'Bike Hire' available at a very reasonable rate.

n Sunday, May 24th, the Chengdu Panda Hash House Harriers celebrated the 1000th Hash of it's oldest member, the Great Dane (Sven Burmester). 



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

The Polar Circle Marathon - often referred to as "the coolest marathon on earth" takes place in Kangerlussuaq, Greenland. The endless ice and arctic tundra of this vast country make up the backdrop of this unusual race, in which runners pass glacier tongues, moraine landscapes and the soundless, arctic desert. This is a rare opportunity to visit one of the most remote corners of the world combined with a challenging running event.

A part of the route takes place on the ice cap itself, but the main part of the course is run on the gravel road (often snow covered) that connects the inland ice with the small township of Kangerlussuaq, just north of the Polar Circle.

The Kayai Marathon & Half Marathon

Jeff Sacchini's Vision Evolves Into A World-Class Event

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he Kauai Marathon and Half Marathon's race founder, Jeff Sacchini, long had a vision of bringing an elite marathon to the island of Kauai. He knew that with

great leadership and Kauai's generous support, the island's aloha spirit would be shared with visitors from around the world.

Seven years later, The Kauai Marathon and Half Marathon is now a signature event for the island scheduled yearly over the Labor Day weekend. This year, the main event takes place on Sunday, September 6th, however the days leading up are equally as exciting with great experiences for the entire family.

Over 1800 marathon and half marathon Runners make their way up Kaumualii Highway on their way to the neighborhoops of Omao, Lawai and Kalaheo.

The headquarters hotel is the luxurious Grand Hyatt Kauai Resort & Spa located in sunny Poipu. They host a number of events including the Sports and Fitness Expo where logoed marathon merchandise, as well as several other active lifestyle vendors are on hand to share their products and services. On Saturday, September 5th there is the 6th Annual Fun Run, a 3-mile "shake out" run that is lead by marathon Host Bart Yasso. This is followed by the Third Annual Keiki Run, which is held oceanfront on the grounds of the Grand Hyatt. Races are available for keiki (children) ages 2-12 and the best part is they get to chase a 6'2" chicken along the course!

However if you carve out some time for relaxation, the resort boasts the best waterslide in the islands, along with a plethora of pools and lagoons. Or, there is always a relaxing treatment at Anara Spa to get you ready for the big day.

Of course Sunday is the main event with the full and half marathon beginning at 6am. New to the 2015 event will be a 5k that begins at 6:30am. This is a great option for runners that like a little less distance in their race experience.

Now for the course...after extensive research on marathon courses, Sacchini finalized the Kauai race course to run through the neighborhoods of Poipu, Omao, Lawai and Kalaheo. The marathon and half-marathon start on Poipu Road in front of the Poipu Shopping Village at 6am, and the first 11 miles are run together. The courses travel up through the 100 year old Tree Tunnel, which offers spectacular views of Kauai's breathtaking mountains. After runners make their way down Highway 50 and Omao Road, the half marathon course enters Kukui'ula Resort where spectacular ocean views highlight the last few miles.

The full marathon heads out to the neighborhoods of Lawai and Kalaheo before heading down a gradual decent back into Poipu. Fortunately, the full and half marathon courses share the same ocean front finish line at the Sheraton Kauai Resort.

Upon completion of the race, all finishers are lei greeted with a commemorative medallion as they exit the chute that opens up to a finisher's party and awards ceremony located on the ocean front lawn at the Sheraton Kauai Resort. Race participants as well as supporters enjoy live local entertainment, ice-cold beer, and plenty of food until the early afternoon. Participants also have the opportunity to receive a complimentary healing massage by one of the event's outstanding massage therapists.

The seventh annual Kauai Marathon is scheduled for Sunday, September 6th. The registration numbers are on pace to exceed the number of runners from last year. Additionally, several wellknown runners have confirmed their participation including 2010 winner Michael Wardian, inaugural winner JT Service, and several elite runners from around the world.



ON THE ICE



The Hash Darwin Awards

Old Chaz, the chap on the right, in one of his sober moments, put forward the notion of "survival of the fittest", a concept that implies that the removal from the gene pool (usually by death) of its weaker members, thereby strengthens the survival chances of the remainder. However, here at OTI, we do not encourage the extermination of the less able, the feeble, or the intellectually challenged. Rather, we encourage them to become hashers! Further, this column aims to be a forum where the moronic misdeeds of hashers might be chronicled in pursuit of that noblest of pastimes, namely, having cheap laughs at other people's expense. With that in mind, I offer the following:

ying: while the ostensibly judgmental types (thankfully, not too prevalent on most hashes) like to claim that they don't do it (such types are often likely to issue similar denials about wanking), I've always found lying, or to calibrate my reference to hashing more precisely, "bullshitting", to be a vital part of the banter that surrounds any hash event. Indeed, stretching the truth a bit is perhaps as vital a hash lubricant as cold beer.

Lying in itself has a long pedigree, stretching back long before Bill Clinton's memorable address to the US and the world stating clearly and unequivocally, and accompanied by much wagging of a slightly phallic index finger, that, "I did not have sexual relations with that woman". Indeed, if we go back to the Bible, when Jonah arrived home after three days away and told his wife that he'd been swallowed by a whale and regurgitated unharmed, we can only applaud his creativity with the truth and ponder how gullible a woman she was.

Indeed, lying is the very stuff of life. US research into how much people lie, conducted by asking people to keep a diary and record how often and to whom they lied, showed both men and women lie in approximately a fifth of their social exchanges lasting 10 or more minutes, and over the course of a week they deceive about 30 percent of those with whom they interact one-on-one. And when it comes to the thorny issue of interaction between the sexes, the results are as you might expect. Eighty-five percent of the couples interviewed in a US study of college students reported that one or both partners had lied about past relationships or recent indiscretions and found that dating couples lie to each other in about a third of their interactions-perhaps even more often than they deceive other people. As an aside here, one researcher looked into specifically the lies men tell women and calculated the top 100. Surprisingly, No. 1 was, "I'll call you". Now, I

would have bet money on the fact that the No. 1 lie would have involved a promise not to allow certain emissions to end up in someone's mouth. If you thought the same, then you are probably a hashman of some world experience and knowledge, or at least at twisted as I am.

But it is "bullshitting" that, if not essential to life, certainly adds some piquancy to it, both in spouting it and in the possibly even more pleasurable act of catching others doing it. I've seen it all on various hashes over the years: people paying for and engraving their own 100run mugs, having done about 20 runs; people arriving in a country sporting hash names they claim to have been awarded in other countries which turn out to be, after a little research, entirely self-bestowed, etc.

It is perhaps in the reminiscencing of past and probably dubious nonhash sporting achievements during the general banter after a hash run that the fan of good bullshitting is apt to find many examples. Even in my own case, when occasionally the talk moves to the game of cricket, I can usually manage to work into the conversation my years playing district cricket in Sydney. "What grade?" my interlocutor usually asks. "A Grade", I modestly reply, taking a sip of my beer. The fact that the district in which I played could field only one grade is not a fact I offer up readily.

As I noted, however, it often the catching out of others that provides a more exquisite frisson of pleasure. Some years ago at a Bangkok hash, I happened to be chatting with a visiting hasher from Sydney. As our conversation progressed he offered up the fact that he had attended Sydney University, my own alma mater, in the mid-1980's, around the time when I was there. Moreover, he claimed to have played Rugby for the storied University Club whilst there. Something in his demeanor led me to smell bullshit. I casually replied, "Oh? What grade?' He responded that he had played for 5th Grade Colts (a lowly-ranked "development" team for young players). "Oh really?" I enquired, sensing I had my man. "You must have known Maurice Cunningham, then." He replied in the negative, saying he couldn't recall the name and that many people had passed through the team in the time he was there.



"What position did he play?" he asked. "He was the coach", I answered.

Thus our conversation was terminated by his abrupt need to walk over to the beer truck and refill his mug. He attended the on-on-on dinner after the run but strangely decide not to sit next to me.

Perhaps it is fitting, though, that Rugby provided the source material for our friend's slightly embellished story, for old rugby players, like old hashers, are wont succumb to the adage, "the older I get, the better I was" and it is well to be skeptical. Consider the wonderful short story, "The Outing", by Dylan Thomas (no mean bullshitter himself) describing a coach-trip to Porthcawl in South Wales, which, inevitably, the increasingly inebriated travelers never reached:

'They stopped at the Hermit's Nest for a rum to keep out the cold. "I played for Aberavon in 1898," said a stranger to Enoch Davies. "Liar," said Enoch Davies.

"I can show you photos," said the stranger.

"Forged," said Enoch Davies.

"And I'll show you my cap at home."

"Stolen."

"I got friends to prove it," the stranger said in a fury. "Bribed," said Enoch Davies.'

So, like Enoch Davies, be on the watch for the bullshit on your next hash. Enjoy the art of catching out others in the act but don't be churlish if you get caught out yourself and suffer a seat on the ice for your troubles. It's only fair.

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

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THE SWEDISH EUROVISION SONG CONTEST RUN # 719

The Eurovision Song Contest, an annual meeting of the mad, the brave and the hopeless, still manages to cause a bit of panic in Sweden. Back in the early seventies all-conquering ABBA took first place establishing a national institution second only in importance to the stomach churning sentimentality of the Summer Sing-Ins at Skansen. Waterloo was the record which laid down the ground rules for the Swedish entries for Eurovision for the next 30 years, the 'bing-a-bong' formula. Sweden haven't been alone however in producing some awful monumentoes, near neighbour Lithuania's only entry to date, Lopsine Mylima by Ovidijus Vysniauskas, finished with a perfect 'nul' score. This was their first and only hit single to date and the band has now broken up with their third base now living in Stockholm.

Apparently it sold over five million copies, a remarkable fact made even more remarkable when you consider that China had less than a million recordplayers in 1967. In one of the more creative explications of European Geography, Morroco participated in Eurovision in 1980, and finished 18th out of 19 entries, with a little ditty called 'Bitaket Hob'

However, not to be beaten an even more creative interpretations of European Geography occurred this year with Australia participating in Eurovision this year, with a little ditty about kangaroos.

We await in wild anticipation for the next contest, to be held in Sweden when presumably the US will enter with driveby shootings, a coke covered bimbo from Brazil and Jamaica with some decent reggae.

Long before this we had lost Termite but that has long since become a worrying moment.


