The BIG HHH EVENT of 2016 will be Interhash XX in Bali. Some 5000 hashers from all over the planet will gather on the Island of the Gods in May. The team that brought you Interhash 2012 in Java is also behind this one in Bali. Expectations are running high that IH 2016 could equal or even exceed IH 2012 honors as the best Interhash ever.

If smaller events are more to your liking, my words of advice are to register early. The days of procrastinating until the very last minute before signing up for your favorite events are long gone. Better safe than sorry is a good credo if you want to insure that there is a rego for you at your favorite events this year. Many of the popular events allow registration transfers if you are unable to attend after you have paid. Keep a close watch for announcements about your favorite events, and sign up as soon as registration opens.

Top events in Europe this year include: Nash Hashes in Belgium (22-14 April), Germany (17-19 June), Denmark (6-8 July), Switzerland 29-31 July), InterCaucasus Hash in Tbilisi (May), and UK Alternative Interhash (May).

Top events in Asia this year include: Interhash Bali (19-22 May), Cambodia Nash (25-27 Mar), Malaysian Nash, Ipoh (29 Apr-1 May), India Nash Hash, Agra, Uttar Pradesh (29 Apr-1 May), and Indochina Mekong Hash, Siem Reap, Cambodia (4-7 Nov).

Top events in the USA this year include: Betty Ford XXX, (11-13 Mar), Texas Interhash (1-4 Apr), Aloha H3 25th Anniversary Birthday Cruise (15-22 Oct).

Top events in Australia and New Zealand this year include: Albany Convict H3 100th (20 Feb), Gold Coast Gourmet H3 2000th (29 Apr-1 May). New Zealand: Gathering of the Nomad H3, Taylor Memorial Lodge National Park (3-6 June).

Top events in Africa this year include: 1000th Run, Kigali H3, Rwanda (23 Jan), and several HHH relay events in Ethiopia, Uganda, Tanzania, and Kenya.

With the emergence of the Beer Mile, the distinction between beer drinking hash house harriers and running "purists" appears to be blurring. If you have a marathon in your sights this year, check Kurt "Swiss Piss" Bodmer's list of Asia Pacific marathons in 2016.

Enjoy the irreverent hash humor of the Stockholm *Absolut Hash Trash*, Nut & Honey's *Adventures of Hash Boy*, and Ian Slater's *On The Ice*.

With scores of great events coming up in the months ahead, I hope to see you on trail in 2016.

Brussels 2014 is behind us, and the next Interscandi and EuroHash are in 2017. However, come to Europe in 2016 for one or more of the fabulous Nash Hashes that Europe has to offer.

The Belgian Nash Hash

22-24 April: Get out your Bling and come to Antwerp! Belgian Nash Hash is hosted by the Brussels Manneke Piss H3 and will be held in historic city of Antwerp, 40 km north of Brussels. Tour the charming city with fabulous architecture and enjoy the best night life in Belgium. There is a new beautiful youth hostel, centrally located with 2 to 6 bed en-suite rooms. It has plenty of light and several gardens in which to enjoy a delicious Belgian beer. In Belgium, there is a beer for all tastes and preferences. Antwerp is famous for its diamond industry, and the Saturday theme will be Diamonds and Bling! On Saturday there will be a run in the forest, and on Sunday, there will be a city run through the old town and along the harbor. After the Sunday circle, one can take a short trip to Leuven for the most brilliant beer festival of them all, Zythos www.zbf.be. The German Nash Hash

17-19 June: Guten Tag, and a big Neanderthal grunt! Pick up your clubs! This year's edition of the German Nash Hash is hosted by the C.R.A.P. H3 (Combined Rhine Area Packs). The weekend features a Saturday run through the Neandertal Forest, so the theme of the weekend is Neanderthals! On the other hand, the accommodation is the brand new and rather stylish Youth Hostel Düsseldorf with 4 and 6 bed en-suite rooms. The hostel is conveniently located very close to the centre of Düsseldorf and public transport. Better yet, it is located near the Düsseldorf Rhine Promenade (a.k.a. "Kasematten") and Altstadt (old town) where one can find more than 250 pubs. The weekend also offers a Red Dress Run, and a pre and post ramble for a total of 5 days of hashing. www.gnh2016.de



The Danish Nash Hash

06-08 July: To hash or not to hash? That is the question! Get out your Viking horns! The fifth Danish Nash Hash will be hosted by the Copenhagen Viking Wankers (CH3) in Helsingør, Denmark, home of Shakespeare's Hamlet. The play is set in the Kronborg (castle) on the North East Coast of Sealand, which was one of the ancient defences of Copenhagen, guarding the sound between it and Helsingborg in Sweden. The hostel is just around the corner and offers 3-5 person rooms. July is the beginning of the short Danish Summer, and there will be swimming opportunities in the sound which will be refreshing and maybe just a little bit cold. Stockholm H3 is running a preamble in Helsingborg on Thursday and will then attempt to invade Denmark the following day. The weekly CH3 hash will be on Monday, so there could be 5 days of hashing for the only the heartiest Viking hasher. Helsingør is 50 km north of Copenhagen and is conveniently accessible by train or from Sweden by ferry.

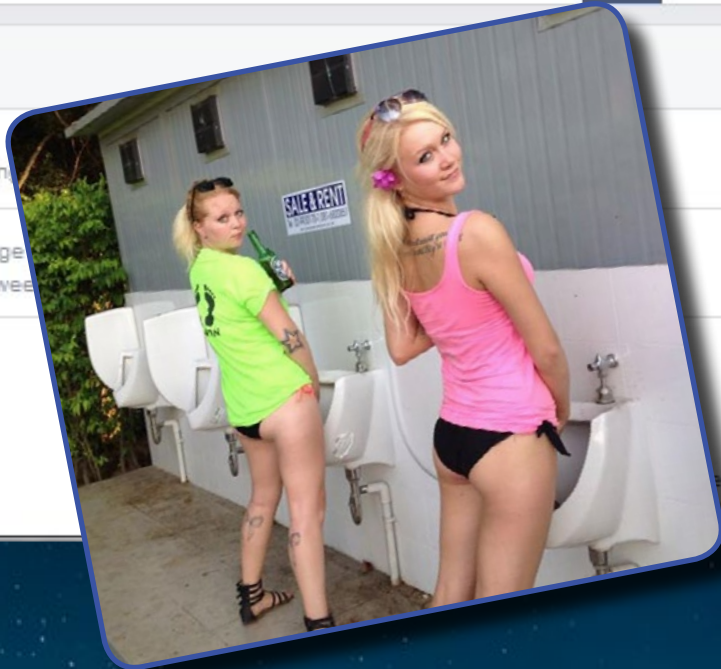

Cambodia Nash Hash is 25-27 March in Sihanoukville. The southern tip of Cambodia is home to the warm waters of the Gulf of Thailand and some beautiful sunsets over the islands off shore. This event includes a boat trip to Koh Rong Samloem, and is limited to 100 participants due to boat and venue capacities. This event is now SOLD OUT.

The Ipoh Hash House Harriets Association will host the **11th Malaysian Nash Hash** in Ipoh, Perak, 29 April-1 May. Ipoh was one of Malaysia's most prosperous cities at the turn of the 19th century due to the booming tin mining industry. During the British colonial era, Ipoh was Malaysia's second city for administrative purposes. Eclectic shop houses characterize the city center. There are several impressive historical buildings including the Railway Station, the Town Hall and the Court House. The sandstone cliffs around Ipoh make it challenging hashing territory.

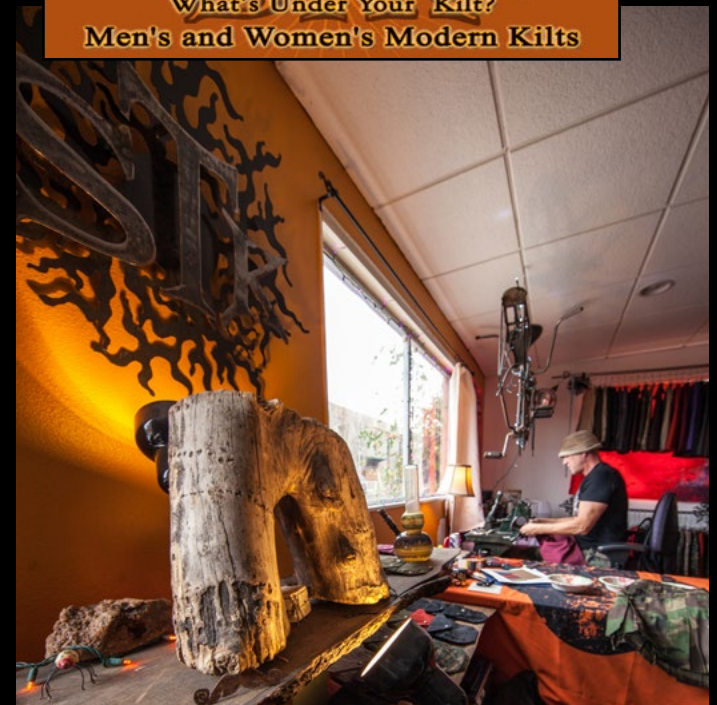
In the Beginning.....

Portland has become a mecca for those who seek the bohemian lifestyle, and in 2009 if you were unemployed, an artist and a renaissance man such as Jonny, it was the place to be. So Jonny left his life in Tucson, Arizona and moved to the City of Roses to focus on his welding art and designing kilts.

In 2010 Jonny teamed up with Todd. The first year was grueling. I could see the look of horror on Todd's face as he described the meager beginnings of Stumptown kilts. But they shared a common goal for the kilt. They could rebuild them. They had the technology. They could make them better than before. Better, stronger.....you get the point!

After one year of designing and 16 different prototypes Stumptown had their utility kilt. The first thing they altered was the waistband that is adjustable if you outgrow your kilt. As you all know, drinking beer isn't the most slimming habit. Secondly, they went with a knife pleat versus a box pleat.

Stumptown Kilts started selling kilts by appointment only, then moved on to their niche market - beer and music festivals. As luck would have it they were introduced to a Portland hasher named Tardcore and well...the rest is history.

You might recognize Jonny and Todd if you did any shopping at the IAH 2015. Their booth in the Bazaar sold 100 kilts within 8 hours. Great job guys! They have 10 wholesalers that sell the kilts retail and also ship internationally.

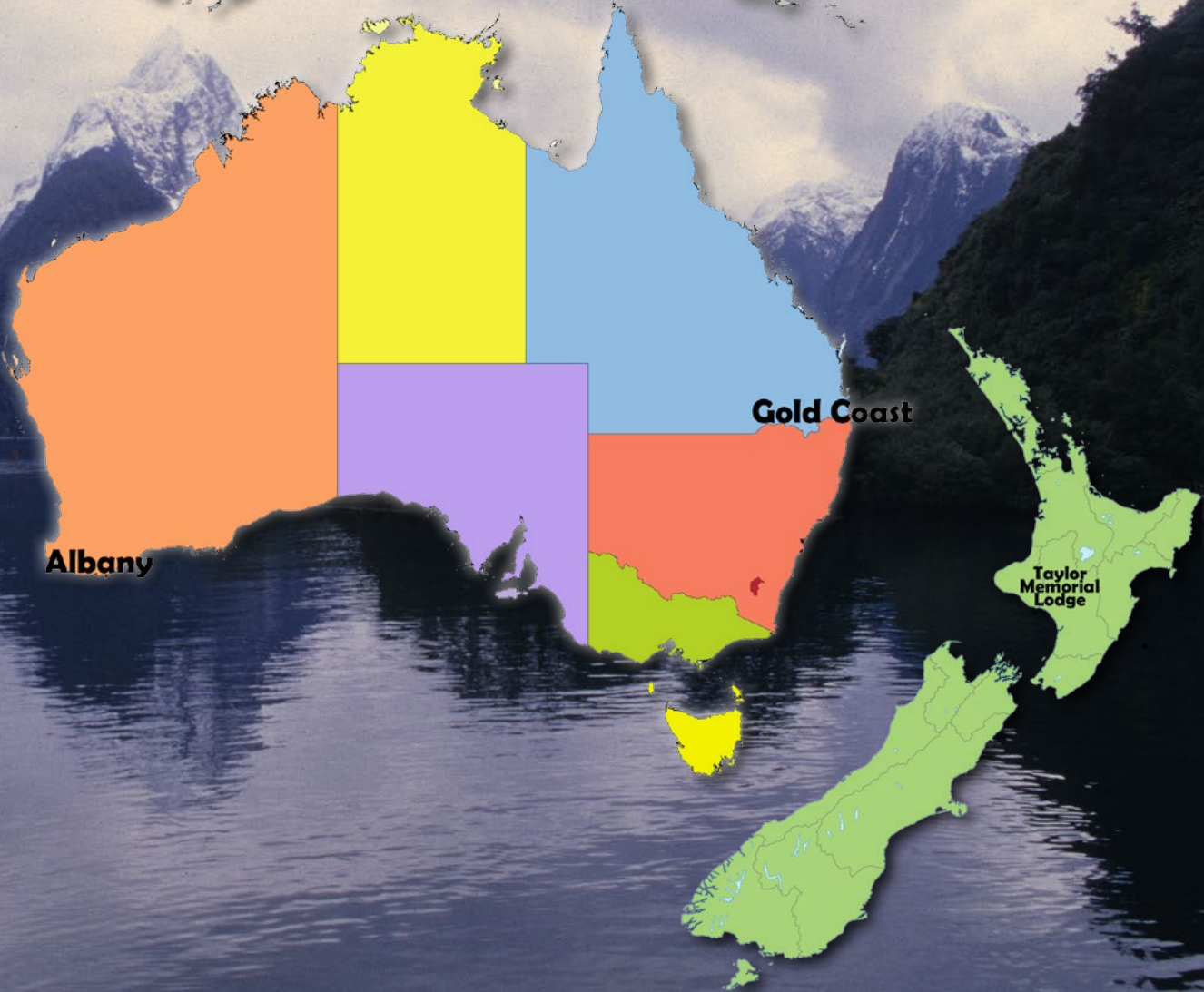

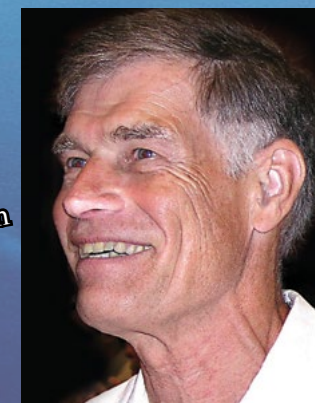

Bagan Temple Marathon 2015

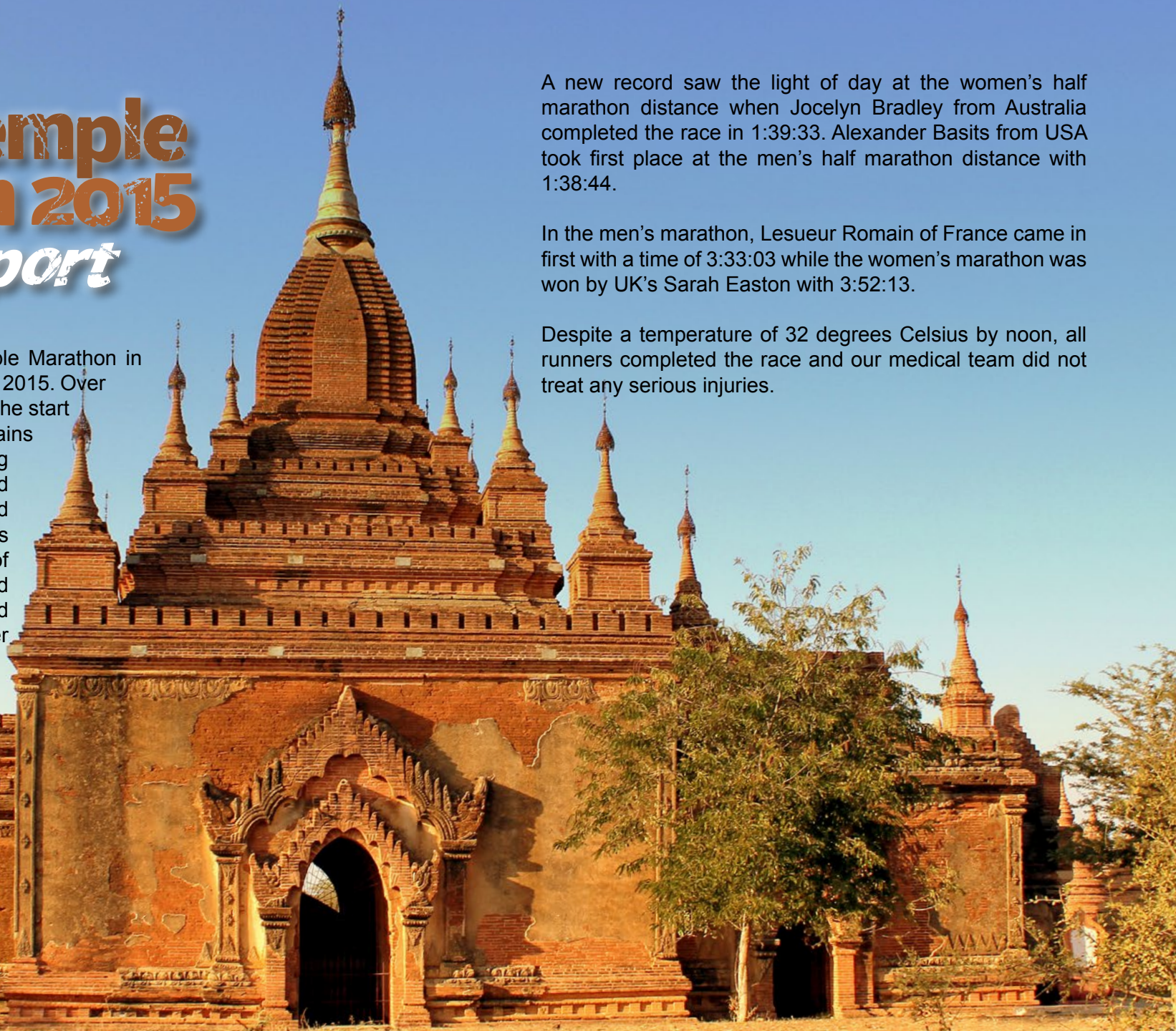
Race Report

The third edition of the Bagan Temple Marathon in Myanmar took place on 28 November 2015. Over 200 runners from 29 nations were at the start line at the Htilominlo Temple on the plains of Bagan ready to embark on a running adventure among two thousand temples. This year, we were honoured to welcome Her Royal Highness Princess Bajrakitiyabha Mahidol of Thailand to our race. She competed in the newly-established 10K race and finished number 5 overall and number 2 in the women's race.

A new record saw the light of day at the women's half marathon distance when Jocelyn Bradley from Australia completed the race in 1:39:33. Alexander Basits from USA took first place at the men's half marathon distance with 1:38:44.

In the men's marathon, Lesueur Romain of France came in first with a time of 3:33:03 while the women's marathon was won by UK's Sarah Easton with 3:52:13.

Despite a temperature of 32 degrees Celsius by noon, all runners completed the race and our medical team did not treat any serious injuries.

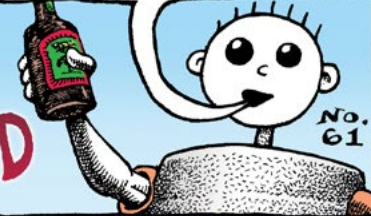

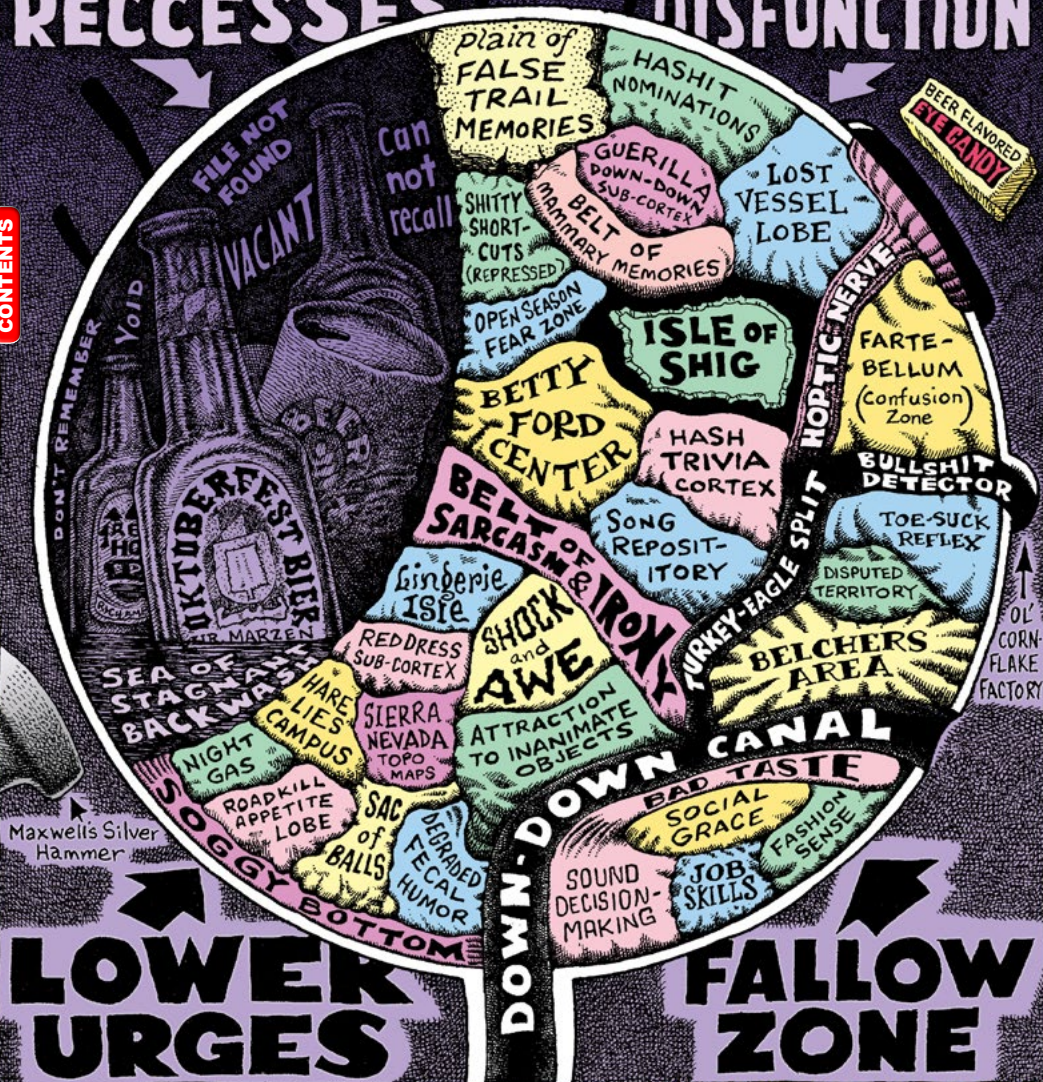

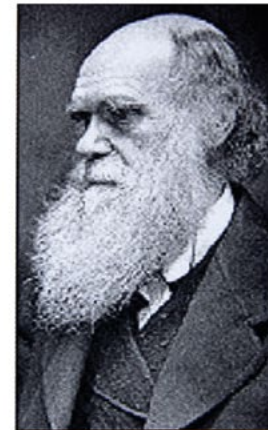

The Hash Darwin Awards

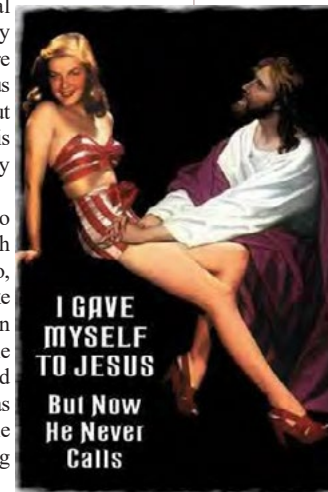

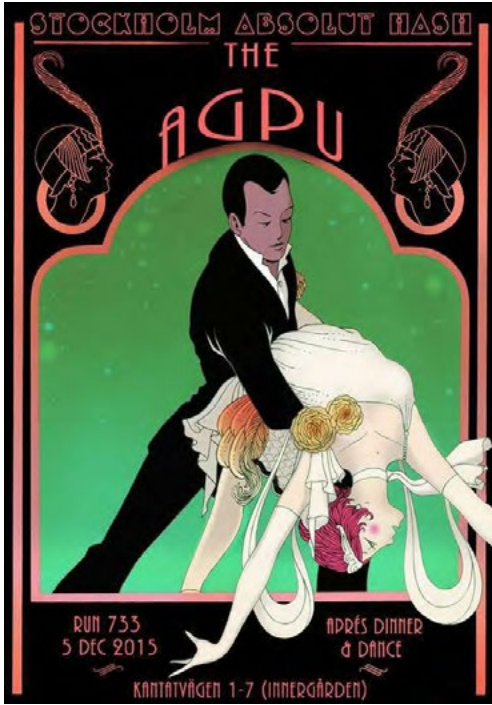

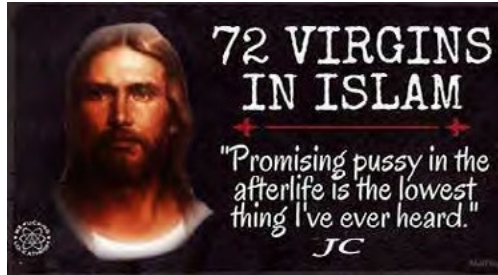


MESSAGE FROM JESUS

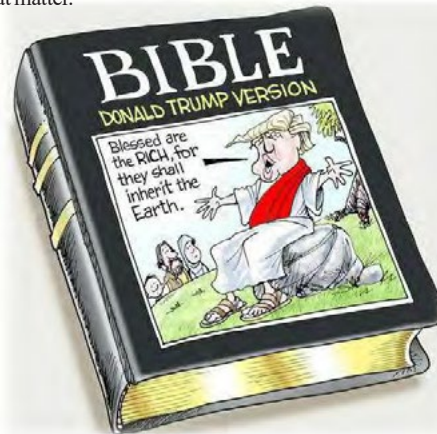

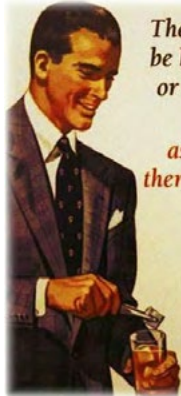

'There's a lot of cock-based names in this area for some reason.' (Could be a Hash influence there somewhere.)

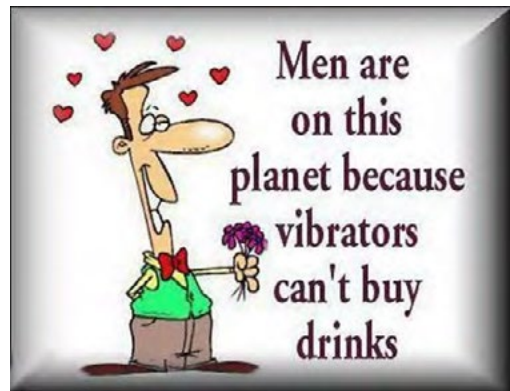

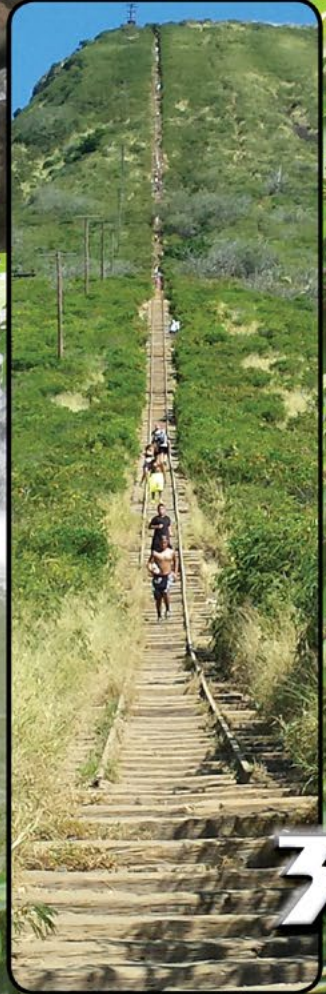

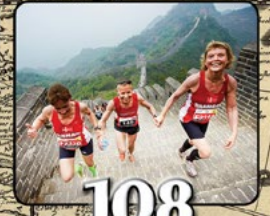
