Minister for Investment, Trade and Tourism ,Hon Faiyaz Koya, flew into Bali to campaign with Team Fiji Hash and address the 6000 strong attendees with the support of Fiji Airways marketing representatives Mr Mitieli Vodonaivalu and spectacular and vibrant performances by Vou Dance group.

Team Fiji's bid is a significant win against experienced and larger representation bids by previous successful InterHash hosts, Medan (Indonesia) and Kuching (Malaysia).

Fiji InterHash will be head quartered in Nadi and running events for the expected 4000 running enthusiasts will include Sabeto Mountains, Nausori Highlands, Abaca, Natadola and the Coral coast to honour the true adventure seeking spirit of the Hash House Harriers.

The Fiji Hash clubs –Nadi, Lautoka Hospital Hash, Suva and Pacific Harbour, led by Dr Ram Raju will be meeting with all stakeholders to begin planning and co-ordination of one of the largest single international sports events to be ever staged in Fiji.

# Interhash 2016 Bali REVIEW

**A**nother successful interhash has concluded, so let's review the event so that the next organizers of interhash (Fiji) can learn from this experience. The event was put on by many of the same folks who put on interhash in Jogjakarta in 2012 which was perhaps the best interhash of all time. It would be hard to equal that experience but this was a well organized and solidly run event. So how did it go?

First, free bus transportation was provided from the airport to the HQ hotel for a few days prior to the start of interhash. This was reminiscent of both the Jogjakarta and Tasmania interhashes. It was a bit confusing at the airport as there were no signs directing hashers to the bus but any seasoned traveler could figure it out. Many of the taxi touts were trying to tell people the buses weren't running and I guess a few people listened to them. But if you read the news blast, it was clearly mentioned when the buses were running. It could have been made a bit clearer where to find the buses, but again I had no difficulty. Free bus transportation was a nice touch.

**Registration** was held at the Inna Grand Bali hotel which is a five star hotel complex that served as the venue for interhash. Registration was in an annex building close to the main lobby. I registered





early Thursday morning. Everything was very efficient. Most hashers used the electronic fast track which was the way to go. This same system was successfully used in Jogjakarta. If you were too lazy to bother to do this ahead of time, you had to go through regular registration which took a lot longer. A table was also set up for the red dress run registration.

**Voting...** One thing different about registration this time was that voting was required after registering before you could get your goody bag or your beer coupons. The voting process was overhauled again to ensure one vote from one person and only that person. As many of us know, voter fraud, ballot stuffing, etc. has been a concern at these events. To try and maintain the integrity of the voting system, every registrant was given a card that had the 3 bidders listed. You were required to rank all 3. So, if you wanted Fiji, you would put a 1, followed by a 2 for your second choice (Medan or Kuching) and a 3 for your third choice. If you left one or two boxes blank, (for example, just put one for Fiji), then your ballot was not counted. I heard there were a couple of hundred ballots that were discarded because they weren't filled out properly (which I personally think was the right thing to do).

After you filled out the ballot, a diagonal section was removed from a corner of the ballot and it was placed in the ballot box. A small nub on your registration band was then cut off and you were then required to dip a finger in some indelible ink. This voting procedure slowed down the whole check in process, especially at peak times, but it ensured EVERYONE voted in a legitimate fashion. I give kudos to the folks that came up with this system. It probably thwarted some voting shenanigans like we have had in the past... **An A for the vote process!**

Could it be improved? Sure, and I've been told it will be tweaked the next time around. Some people said they would have liked to have heard the bid presentations before voting but would it have made a





difference? These bid presentations are boring affairs most people skip. And usually it's a pack of lies anyway. If it's that important to you, go to their websites and review the info there before heading to interhash. In the future, I think these bid presentations should be eliminated entirely with all the relevant details posted at least two weeks in advance of interhash. The audio-visual presentations are holdovers from the past before we had the Internet.

One thing that was not mentioned during registration was that you could leave the hall after doing your fast track registration and go visit the booths before voting, but how many people are going to do that? Review the info on the bidders websites before you head to interhash.

After voting was completed, you got your goody bag.. In short, one of the best ever.. I really like the backpack. Very functional and sturdy. Within the backpack, we got two polo shirts.. There was a garish red/pink one and a blue/green one. Both were devoid of advertising bling which is a good thing. I've noticed recently that a lot of hash tshirts are starting to look like running race tshirts with every sponsor listed on the back or front or both. If a beer sponsor is listed on the sleeve, I'm okay with that. But I'm not okay with a shirt covered with sponsor advertising. So kudos to Bali for not following this trend. Lots of other stuff in the bag too, including a nice toiletry bag, nail clippers in the shape of a foot, a metal bottle opener, a pair of sandals, a small cloth hand towel, a patch, hash event booklet, a nice metal insulated mug which you were supposed to use during the weekend, a lanyard, a sarong, a luggage tag, and miscellaneous other stuff. **A+ for the bag!**

After exiting the annex building, there was a large area near the pool where the hash bazaar was located. many hashers congregated here before and after registration to use the two free drink tickets they were given after voting. I guess it would have been nice if we just had





unlimited free beer at the HQ site for registered hashers, but you can't have everything. This was the same system used in Jogjakarta.

**Communications..** This is something many organizers fall short on and something that Fiji needs to remember. Good communication is essential before and during these events. IH2012 in Borobodur did an outstanding job in this department. Newsblasts were pretty good for this event too although not as frequent as we had in 2012. The magazine in the goody bag was an excellent source of information. I actually looked at it instead of reading it on the plane trip home. I hope Fiji takes note of this. Frequent communications to the masses are key to a successful event. **B+ for communications**

**Food..** Great variety every night, and generally lots of it, but there were some small queues. Some people complained they didn't get any food, or there was little left when they arrived. But if you got there when the venue opened, no problem. Some buses returned late from the runs so some of these folks missed out. (This is one reason why I usually choose a run with a fairly short bus ride). Box lunches were also provided on the run buses. In general, good job on the food. **B+**

#### **Transportation and logistics..**

Staging for all runs was done from the HQ hotel. There was an open area close to the main building which was perfect for boarding and unboarding... No long walks a kilometer down the road to get to the staging area (as has been done at some previous interhashes). This went fairly smoothly as far as I could tell. However, on

Saturday, the buses for run 3 never showed up so that run was canceled on Saturday. Not sure what happened there. Someone told me they

sent extra buses out to the ballbuster run and these had originally been designated for run 3. Buses were comfortable. That was good as many of the bus rides were at least an hour or 90 minutes away. Most of the runs had bus departures at 11 AM, but run 1 buses left at 3 PM for those who slept in. **Grade: A-**

**Event venue..** IH2016 had just one venue which was the beach area behind the main hotel tower building. It was a long rectangular area which had a large stage at one end (north end) with two auxiliary screens on either side. I didn't think it was a large enough area for 5000 hashers. If you were at the south end, you couldn't really see or hear what was going on at the north end by the stage

area. They should have had auxiliary screens and loudspeakers set up midway so those in the back could see and hear the show too. Fiji, please take note of this. There were Indonesian dance performances, and a fire dancing performance but for those of us at the south end, we could barely see it let alone hear it which was a shame. The whole area also didn't seem that secure from gate crashers. It was easy for people to enter the area without a wrist band. I saw a couple of people get removed by security when hashers reported them. This may have contributed to the food running out early on Saturday night.

Another comment I would make is there really wasn't any provision for inclement weather (something I have seen at previous interhashes). But it wasn't an issue as there wasn't a single drop of rain the entire weekend. Sooner or later though, it's going to bite a future organizer in the ass.

I made this same comment four years ago when reviewing the Borobodur event and told hainan to take note of it. They did not and bad weather did affect their event.





Also, there were no toilets or portable potties on the beach venue site. You had to use the hotel facilities. It would have been nice had they set up a few of these. There were a few folks bitching about this.

**Grade for event venue: C+**

**Runs...** In general, it sounded like this went off pretty well. No problems with locating buses for the runs, and they pretty much stuck to the schedule posted in the magazine. Runs were very well described in the magazine including elevation changes, so I don't think anyone was surprised by the run they chose except maybe run 8. They had a rope climb which was needed to get out of a steep ravine. It was quite arduous from what I heard. Lunch boxes were provided on the buses or when they arrived at the run start. Trails were well marked with paper. I chose run 1 on Serengan island which was flat and easy but it was not very scenic. Circles were held at the run sites.

There were also side runs. Hamersley offshore run was on Friday which I did. Also, the red dress run on Thursday drew over 2000 registrants. This was a leisurely stroll down the beach road and then back again along the beach sidewalk. Lots of cultural shows were set up along the way and many people stopped in various bars along the route. Not many people did the entire trail as there were many opportunities for short cuts. Plenty of food and beer was available when we got back to the hotel but if you got back late, you missed out on the food.



For those who stuck around on Monday, there was a full moon memorial run which attracted several hundred hashers. This was a tribute to recently departed hashers. It was also held on the beach but several miles south of the main headquarters hotel.

# 2016 Cambodian Nash Hash RECAP

**A** new event that has cropped up in recent years on the hash calendar is the Cambodia Nash Hash. Although only in existence for five years, the event has grown in popularity. The most recent one, in fact, was sold out. Held in the seaside town of Sihanoukville, those of us who attended experienced an extremely well organized event.

For those of you who have never heard of this place, Sihanoukville is a developing resort town located on the gulf of Thailand with miles of beautiful beaches, many of which are devoid of beach chairs, umbrellas, vendors selling crap, etc. It's what Phuket Thailand was like 30 or more years ago. And like Phuket, it is slowly getting discovered. Lots of backpackers are there right now, but it's only a matter of time until the big hotel chains set up shop.

The hash there is pretty small but they have their own dedicated hash bar, Charlie Harper's, which is where registration and the welcome party took place on Thursday night. Everyone got at least one free

beer and heavily discounted beer after that. I think they were charging 50 cents for a beer! Registration went smoothly and we got the usual package of goodies: tshirt, patch, coozie, and a schedule of events which apparently a few people didn't bother to read (more on that later). Roughly 120 people registered. As already mentioned, the event was capped primarily because of the boat trip on Friday where capacity was limited. Wankers came from all over the world for this extravaganza with Pattaya, Hamersley, and Phnom Penh sending large groups.

The schedule indicated an early start Friday morning, so the debauchery was somewhat subdued on Thursday night..

Friday, in my opinion, was the highlight of the weekend. We all got on buses for the trip to the ferry landing where we boarded a party boat that had been reserved for the hash. Safety was paramount! A Cambodian police official came onboard and demanded everyone don their life jackets. He then started taking pictures of different groups. Someone asked why he was doing this. He said if the boat sank, he could prove to his boss that everyone had their life jacket on. His concern for our safety was touching.. Safety third!

We then departed for the exotic island of Koh Rong Sanloem. This was about a 3 hour journey. We had a swim stop along the way





followed by lunch.. We arrived at the island around midday. It was a spectacular setting.. Beautiful beach, crystal clear water: everyone was taking pictures.. I've been to lots of beautiful beaches in the world and I can honestly say this was in the top five. There were two hash trails. I don't know where the long trail went but the short trail followed a path to the other side of the island (maybe 2k at most) where we were greeted by another beautiful beach and a beach bar. After that arduous journey, we were ready for a beer or two. We then returned back along the same path to the start. The circle was held on the beach.. Lots of ice blocks and of course, the bucket, which was a pool of crushed ice water.

The Hamersley boys were the focus of attention and they spent plenty of time on the ice. They awarded the Hamersley wanker tshirt to the main organizer of the Cambodian Nash hash: Mullaway, who wore it proudly at least for one day!

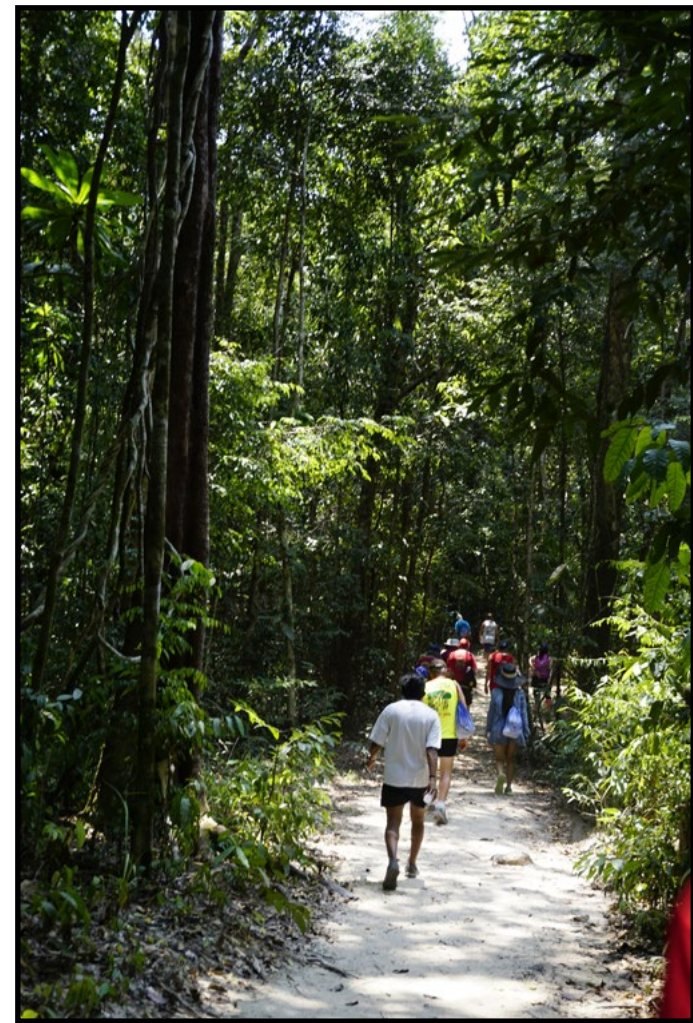

When we got back to shore, we then headed off to the purple bar where we had a bbq dinner on the beach. It was a fantastic day out!

The run started from Ochheuteal beach and was an a to b run. It started out great as we scrambled over a cliff to another beach. But then we went on a long slog through





some back parts of Sihanoukville.. It wasn't where the tourists go, that's for sure. Circle was held in a clearing off a busy road. A couple of highlights from the circle: Bimbo, who wandered in DFL when the circle was nearly over. He went off and did the eagle trail at the split and got lost. After the circle, we walked a few hundred meters to the Samnang restaurant where we had dinner.





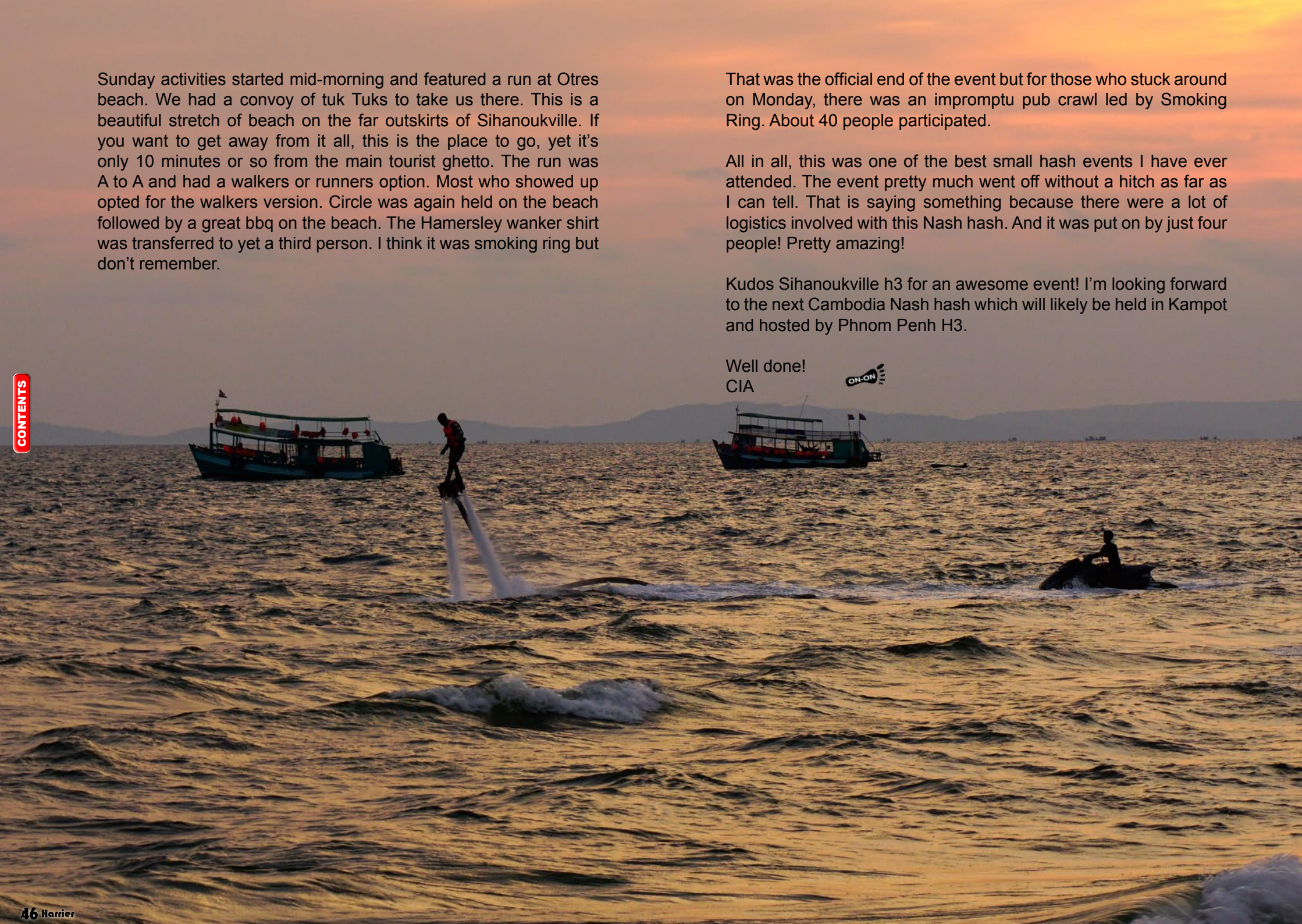

I was browsing the UK Hash site that was run by good old Prof for many years and came across the attached article about old G, the founder of the Hash. It was put together by Amnesia with a generous dollop of plagiarism of the works of good old Magic, with whom Prof and G are presently frolicking on a false trail in the great On Home.

I already knew the facts about G, but thought I'd mention a couple of things that the article brought to what's left of my mind. One is that G's birthday is the same as my dear bride's, dear young Sex Obect (aka Elena). The other is that Amnesia (or someone) went to the same trouble I did in tracking down G's gravestone in the cemetery at Brockley. I took photos as well, but somehow lost them, so thanks to Amnesia I now have a substitute.

But bear in mind that this is not his grave. He was blown to bits by a mortar in Singapore and there was nothing left to bury, let alone send back to England. So when Simon strolled into The Wanch seeking employment as a bartender, Howard was understandably intrigued by the fellow's unusual surname. Dances with Dogs: 'Gispert, eh? That's an unusual name. Tell me, did your father by any chance get killed during the defense of Singapore in 1941?'

Simon: 'Yes, that's right! How on earth did you know that?'

Dances with Dogs: 'Bloody hell, because your dad was G, the founder of the Hash House Harriers!'

Simon: 'The what?'

Dances with Dogs: 'You've never heard of the Hash?'

Simon: 'Um, no. What is that?'

The rest is Hashtory. DWD explained the Hash to the son of its founder, who didn't have a clue that to at least one significant niche of humanity his father was a bloody star, a hero, a founding father! He immediately hired him, and started telling everyone he know about

his incredible find. When Tim 'Magic' Hughes found out - especially when he discovered that Simon was a graphic artist in addition to his bartending skills - he entreated him to design a logo for Magic's incomparable magazine Harrier International (which by the way now has a facsimile publication going in Magic's home town, Bangkok).

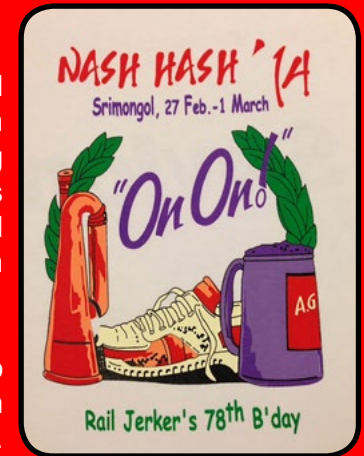
Simon did so, and came up with the famous logo with the bugle, running shoe and beer mug shown below. A copy of this classic Hash icon is attached.

Magic and Dances with Dogs dragged Simon over to the 8th World Interhash at Phuket in July 1992, where he and Magic spent the entire weekend flogging T-shirts with the logo, each one signed by Simon. There weren't a lot of takers - Hashers are notoriously cheap bastards. But I'm proud to state that I bought one. I've never worn it, and never will. It's special.

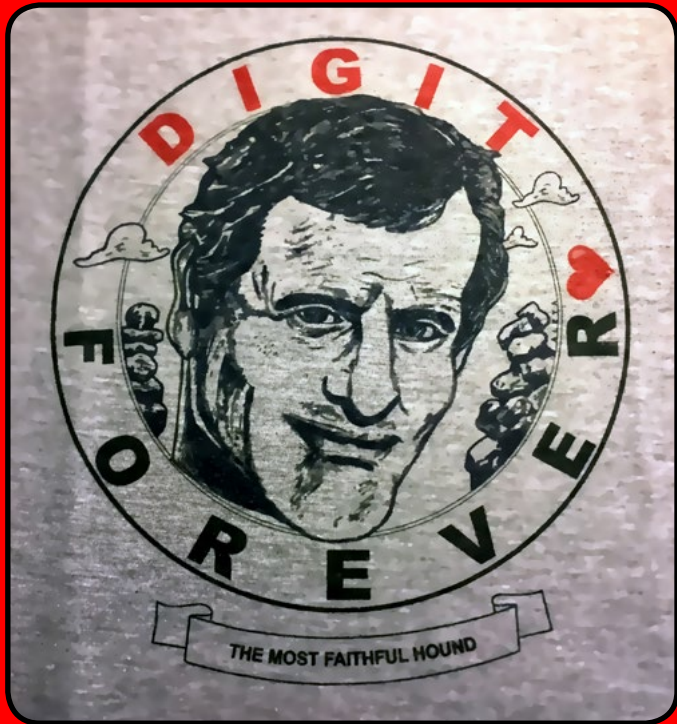
If anyone out there knows how to contact either Howard or Simon, please let me know. I sent a message to The Wanch, but no one answered it.

# Hashing in Mozambique

**M**aputo, the capital of Mozambique located in southern Africa has a very lively and social hash chapter. Known as the Maputo Hash House Harriers, they are a mixed hash which have been running every Saturday afternoon since 1987.

Due to work commitments I have been lucky to join them on 3 occasions now and hash runs have involved anything from hashing around the slum areas to the beach. Every Saturday afternoon, hashers meet at Aeroclub De Mozambique, the hash house of Maputo which boasts a small bar and restaurant where an average of 50 hashers meet to receive driving instructions with a checkpoint from the hares and newcomers welcomed and rounded up into different cars for lifts.





The run sites are not normally far out of town with my first Maputo hash being down some flat muddy trails off the beach road where there was not a soul to be seen. In contrast my second hash being around Mafalala, the oldest township in Maputo where many famous leaders from the Independence movement were born.

My third hashing experience was at the beach - Ponto do Ouro, a small resort village near the South African border on a hash weekend away where getting there involved lots of driving through sand trails with a 4-wheel drive trying to avoid not ending up in South Africa. There were two hashes over the three days always featuring a run on the wide sandy beaches near the crashing waves of the Indian Ocean.

Runs always include beer stops with snacks and once even a champagne stop, not a norm but a special occasion to mark the 40th birthday of one of the hashers.





Circles are always held back at the clubhouse and involve a number of features such as special hats for the FRB, birthday hasher, hash shit and a hash shit award which made an active and lively circle. A drinking plank with 4 beers also adds to the fun. Plenty of down downs of M. Beer, a local beer were had for various charges or rats as they are called on Maputo Hash.

The chapter are also very social during the week too with Wednesday being a meet up at the Aeroclub for drinks and TGIF on Friday moving around to different restaurants. For those who want to get out further to the real bush, the Matola Hash House Harriers meet once a month on a Sunday although at the moment featuring more on organising hash weekend aways to places like Swaziland.

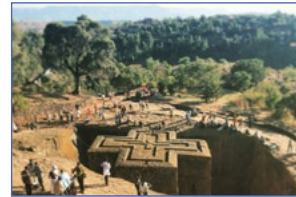

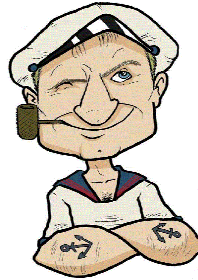

**C**ebu Hash is close to 20 years old and is based in and around Cebu City (approximately half way up or down on the east coast of Cebu Island).

Cebu is a longish, thin island with a narrow coastal plain along each coast with a multitude of steep sided hills running south to north along its central spine. For Hashers, this means that much of the flat land is built up or fenced in. This leaves the hilly interior for most of our Runs. Browse our website at <http://cebuhash.org/index.php> to see the sort of places we regularly Hash.





Unfortunately, some of these places are a tad off the beaten track – they might not require a 4 wheel drive vehicle to get there but definitely need something with a high ground clearance (SUV, pickup, etc). Normally, we use our own vehicles to get to the start of our Runs. This can be problematical when we have a shit load of visitors to transport.

Cebu City itself has many upmarket (expensive) hotels and a wide variety of lower cost (but OK) places to stay at. There are also a handful of large (expensive) beach resorts scattered around the island. Unfortunately, the more economical resorts are not very large.

Despite possible transport and accommodation problems, Cebu HHH was proud to be accepted as the venue for the 2017 Philippine Nash Hash.

**We have fixed the date as the 3 day weekend starting Friday May 19<sup>TH</sup> 2017 through to Sunday May 21<sup>ST</sup>.**

We are working on the host of logistics matters regarding accommodation, transport, grub, beer, etc with an aim of bringing the whole thing off within a budget of between 3,500 and 5,000 Peso.

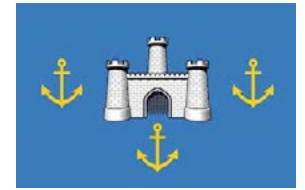

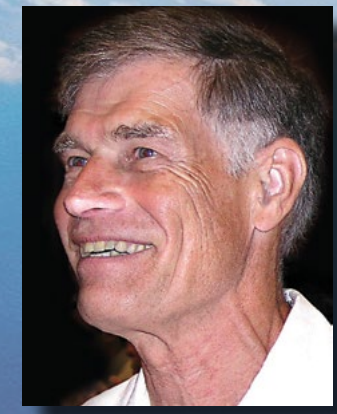

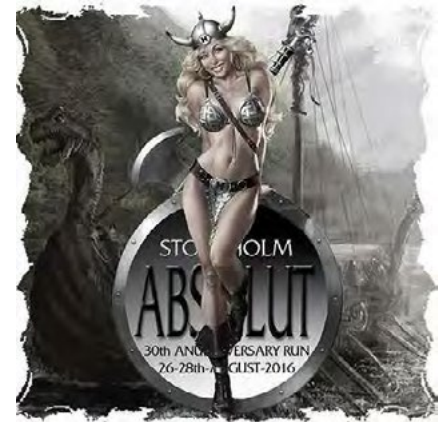

## VIKING SHIP FOUND IN WAIMANALO HAWAII

Mystery as ancient as the Norseland sagas of a thousand years ago shrouds the uncovering of remains of a Viking long ship in a little used sandstone quarry near Waimanalo. The discovery, made by workmen employed by a Honolulu contractor, is regarded by the few local scientists who have heard of it as challenging the accepted theory of the discovery of the Hawaiian Islands.

A preliminary scientific survey of the remains appears to prove beyond doubt that roving Norsemen landed on the shores of Hawaii long before the arrival of Juan Gaetano, the Spanish explorer and navigator.

It may also prove that the "foreigners with light complexions and bright eyes" who, according to tradition arrived here in the 13th century were, in truth, Viking rovers from the far northland and not the crew of a Japanese junk.

These Norsemen, if such they were, may have been the first Europeans ever to enter the Pacific area.

The remains of the Viking long ship, or dragon ship, have been identified as such by Dr. Thorkel Gellisson, archeologist with the Royal Society of Northern Antiquaries of Oslo, Norway, who has been here several weeks sketching edged weapons in the Honolulu Academy of Arts collection.

Dr. Gellisson was one of the first scientists to be notified of the Waimanalo discovery. He has definitely recognized the remains as those of a longship of the ancient Vikings very similar to the one found at Gokstad, near Sandefjord on the fjord of Christiania.

Dr. Gellisson is of worldwide repute. It will be recalled that he deciphered the ancient inscriptions on the Babylonian papyrus discovered in 1933 at Keirrttoh, Mesopotamia, and has more recently figured as the leader of the archeological expedition which uncovered the ruins of the ancient Aztec metropolis of Xaohgib, in southern Mexico.

Removal of a large block of sandstone at the Waimanalo quarry revealed a long and wide hollow beneath, and as other blocks were taken out the rotted timbers forming what remained of the hull of the Viking ship were uncovered.

The workmen, sensing they had found something of genuine value, notified their employer who, after viewing the longship's remains, communicated with local scientists, including Dr. Gellisson.

At the request of Dr. Gellisson extreme care was exercised in completely exposing the remains. So secretly was the matter dealt with that it was not until today that official announcement of the discovery was made. Nearly two weeks were required in clearing out the pit in which the Viking ship had rested for so many generations.

Great care was taken by workmen under Dr. Gellisson's direction in sifting all of the sand surrounding the longship's remains and many interesting discoveries resulted, further substantiating the identity of the craft.

Approximately one quarter of the longship was found intact, including the stern with its towering and elaborately carved figurehead — the object which had first attracted the attention of the workmen. The remainder of the hull was little more than bits of timber, although the ship's shape and length were easily discerned.

Apparently it had been about 78 feet long, with a beam of about 16 feet and a depth of approximately six feet. It was



built of overlapping planks of oak, hand hewn, fastened together by wooden pins with here and there braces of iron bands and rudely fashioned rivets.

Remains of benches, obviously seats used by rowers, indicated according to Dr. Gellisson that the longship pulled 32 oars, 16 to a side. Near the centre was what remained of a series of crosspieces obviously used to support a mast.

Search was made for traces of a mast but nothing was found. Also discovered was the broken wooden blade of what was apparently the rudder, or steer-bord, from which the term starboard of modern maritime usage was derived.

An outstanding find, other than the ship itself, was a badly corroded sword with an iron blade which had steel edges — unmistakably the work of a Viking smith.

The weapon measured four feet and three inches from tip of blade to end of hilt, and the blade itself was approximately two inches wide. The hilt of the sword had apparently been fashioned from a series of thick leather rings. Beneath the iron hand guard and wrought into the blade was a small square of silver bearing an inscription which, according to Dr. Gellisson, indicated that one Valthiof the Pilgrim was either the owner or maker of the weapon.

There were also several badly split pieces of walrus tusk and part of the jaw of a fur seal, evidently proof that the route taken by the Viking ship was from the north, probably through the Bering Sea and down the coast of Alaska — a channel that for centuries was believed a myth although mentioned in ancient Norse sagas.

Absence of skeletal remains in or about the longship was not unusual. If there were such remains they had long since crumbled to dust, it was probable that if those aboard the vessel were alive when it landed and they wandered inland and were either assimilated or killed by the natives.

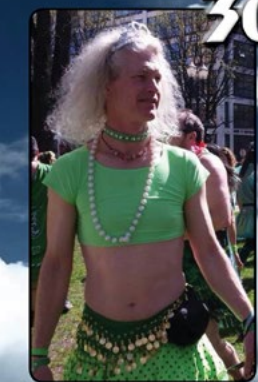

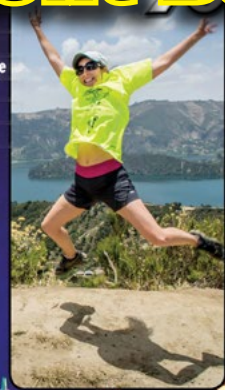

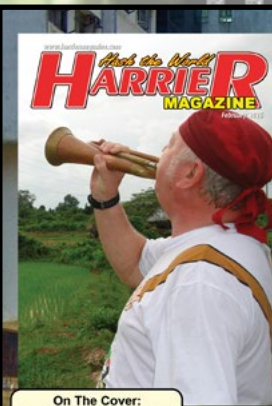
