A Great story from Japan

Hi Shakes,

I much enjoyed the "If I had a time machine - 30 Hashes I would like to travel back to!" item in your April/May issue.

Since I only joined the Tokyo Hash in 1980, I can't shed any light on a contretemps in a bar between TH3 and the yakuza "around 1979", but I can tell you about another, probably more dramatic incident that happened a few years later.

On a fine Monday evening in one of Tokyo's most upscale residential areas (and right outside the go-to supermarket for the expat community) one of the FRBs made the mistake of banging on the bodywork of a Cadillac that had blatantly jumped a set of red traffic lights. (No self-respecting yakuza would be seen driving anything else at the time: that particular car had, as we subsequently discovered, apparently been confiscated from a doctor who had presumably been a little late repaying his debts). Three heavies jumped out of the car, only to be outnumbered as the slower members of the pack arrived in force. At this point any thoughts of confrontation on the part of our intrepid heroes were abandoned as one of the yakuza reached back into the car and brandished a samurai sword! The incident unfortunately did not end well, as the heavies targeted one of our smaller Japanese members, threw him to the floor and put the boot in big time. Not funny - he had to pay a visit to the local A&E, as I recall.

There was an interesting postscript to the story which doubtless sheds light on the relationship between the yakuza and the police: not only were the local cops extremely slow in reacting at the time of the assault, but afterwards Tokyo's finest did everything they could to dissuade both the victim of the attack and other Hash members from pressing charges or pushing for an investigation. 

### Interhash

An announcement dated 2023–May-15

The following changes have been made to the leadership of the IH24 organising committee.

a. Following a IH24 committee meeting, BlueVain has resigned as Chairman.

b. BlueVain has also relinquished his committee positions as "Food Manager" and "Goodie Bag Manager" and will not be active on committee henceforth.

These changes have been made to address the matters raised within the notice of motion proposed at the NZ Nash Hash 2023 GM's meeting and then published as a "Letter of No Confidence", issued to the World Interhash Council and immediately viewed by many hashers across the world.

The following should be also recorded as a response to matters noted in the No Confidence post regarding financial transparency and accountability.

a) All funds are now secured with "2 out of 3" signatory requirement, two of the three being current IH24 committee members.

b) Reconciliation of all accounts (including Red Dress and Exclusive Red Dress events, and managed accommodation bookings) is well underway.

c) The current IH24 committee is progressing the establishment of an Incorporated Society.

Going forward:

• Subject to NZGM acceptance and endorsement of the above points 1 and 2 it is the IH24



"current" committee intention to issue (through the NZGM) a welcome to any hasher in NZ who is now prepared to rejoin the organising committee, or to join as a "new face".

• It remains IH24 committee firm commitment to managing and delivering a successful World Interhash event in Queenstown in March 2024.

### And from the Interhash Council:

The Interhash Council fully supports the NZ GMs in their vote of no confidence. We have been in continual contact with Bluevain since November, trying to persuade him to allow his committee members authority to carry out their roles. We obviously want this Interhash to be a success and we still stand ready to provide support to the rest of the Interhash NZ Committee, if they gain control and are willing to involve the Interhash Council,



Cor's son, *Magic Poofta*, would also be leaving to study in the States. Both father and son, incidentally, were Dutch not Belgium.



# The classic years!

# **1st China Nash Hash** Beijing 18th-19th May 2002

The idea of a Nash Hash as part of the **Beijing H3** 1000th celebrations was raised over Qingdao Beers and Margaritas at the Mexican Wave. *ED: The first ex-pat bar to open in Beijing and owned by Mad Greg of the Beijing H3.* 

*Ratcatcher* contacted John *Roomboy* Malins in Chengdu and Doug *White Trash* Barretts in Shanghai. They passed the news on to the smaller hashes scattered around China at the time.

www.hashchina.com was established to promote the event.


The date was set for May 18th -19th 2002 as May offered a good chance of better weather.

Therefore, from March onwards Beijing runs were numbered 999A 999B etc. so that the 1000th could be pushed to the May date.

The 1000th run took place on May 18th while the next day the run was labelled as Nash Hash/ Beijing 1009th. Order was thereby returned to the Universe.

Ratchucker, Room Boy and White Trash met and selected Shanghai as the obvious venue for the next event. At some point this took the title Pan China Time table May 18th Beijing 1000th Fragrant Hills Hares: *Rug Burn, Ratcatcher, Prickly Nipples, Quick Drawer* 

May 19th Nash Hash/ Beijing 1009th 4 runs Great Wall (*Wrong Way, Artsy Fartsy, Chris Fry*) Ming Tombs (*Rat*) Old Summer Palace (*Rear entry, Masturbaker*) Houhai Lake (*Chubby, OP, Don*)







# **Rule 3 - No Poofters**

For many years any act of affection in the circle was likely to bring a cry of '*Rule 3 No Poofters*'

While not politically correct, this was never an expression of anti-gay sentiments but an homage to a famous Monty Python sketch.

The Bruces sketch originally appeared in a 1970 episode of Monty Python's Flying Circus. It was later performed on audio recordings and live on many occasions by the Monty Python team.

Eric Idle co-wrote the sketch with Cleese and said he based it on his Australian friends from the 1960s "who always seemed to be called Bruce".

The sketch involves four stereotypical Australians, all wearing khakis and cork hats. All are named Bruce.

The skit begins with three Bruces sitting at a table, as someone sings Waltzing Matilda in the background. The boss Bruce arrives with a new staff member, a "pommie" named Michael Baldwin (played by Terry Jones).

The group are identified as the Philosophy Department of the University of Woolloomooloo. The department appears to be situated in nothing more than a simple wooden building somewhere near Uluru/Ayers Rock (which is visible in the distance behind them).

Because Baldwin's first name is different from that of everyone else, he is asked if he minds being called "Bruce" to avoid confusion.

The Bruces all have a common fondness for lager beer and a dislike of "poofters" (a derogatory Australian and English slang word for a homosexual).

John Cleese's recites the seven faculty rules at the University of Woolloomooloo:

No poofters.

### Working Up a thirst

The club was known locally as the "Hash House" so the name was adopted by the harriers and it stuck.

# **Tiger** *The* **Original Hash Beer** 1940-41

### 1932

Tiger Beer is launched as the first beer brewed in Singapore. There are considerable problems to overcome. There are no local barley or hops, the temperature makes brewing difficult and there is a lack of ice!

### 1937

The famous tiger badge is adopted by 230 squadron (See box next page).

### 1939

Tiger wins its first international beer medal.

### 1939

Tiger becomes the official hash beer. It was probably late 1939 or 1940 before beer was provided at the run site, and then it was Tiger '*a headache in every quart*' mixed with ginger beer to form a shandy. On A to B runs the Malay drivers would be sent off to the finish point with supplies of cold beer and the result was that the hashers started to stay much longer at the 'on in'. Making a shandy required the purchase of enamel mugs. As troops move into the region Tiger became popular with Commonwealth servicemen.

### 1945

With ingredients difficult to find a watery Tiger Club brand is introduced.

### 1954

Tiger takes a Commonwealth Gold Medal in the bottled beer competition.

### 1956

Anthony Burgess (A Clockwork Orange) publishes his first novel. Set in Malaysia during the emergency it is called **Time for a Tiger** (1956)

### 1965

Tiger appears in cans for the first time.

### 1973

There are the first TV ads.

### 2010

Tiger finally becomes an official Interhash beer at Kuching.



A hash legend..... from Brunei

Around 1974 John Chalmers fell on a run and returned to the circle with thorns in his flesh. Brunei thorn trees are not like English rose thorns, they are big and nasty like spears! The wounds wouldn't heal and Chalmers eventually needed to go to UK. On his return he missed his connection in Dubai – according to the hash legend *because the airport bar stocked Tiger Beer.* The plane he missed (presumably flight G-ASGR) was hijacked and flown to Libya!

Used on an RAF Badge

No. 230 Squadron was a flying boat squadron that served in the Indian Ocean and the Mediterranean during the Second World War.

It was formed at Pembroke Dock on 1 December 1934 and the following year received its first aircraft, the biplane Short Singapore III,

By mid 1938 the squadron was **based in Singapore** where it started converting to the more modern Short Sunderland. It was fully equipped by the start of the Second World War. The squadron was initially used to provide patrols over the Indian Ocean and the approaches to Malaya and Singapore.

In October a detachment was posted to Ceylon, and by February 1940 the entire squadron was based there. The remaining Singapore-based personnel transferred to No. 205 Squadron.

In May 1940, with Italy about to enter the war, the squadron was moved to the Mediterranean where it flew reconnaissance sorties for the Mediterranean fleet and anti-submarine patrols. The squadron was based in Egypt, but from June began to use Kalafrana, Malta, as an advanced operating base.

The squadron was disbanded at Pembroke Dock in 1946.

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# Interhash The Survivors



**The Survivors** are those who have attended every Interhash. An early Hash publication, *Half a Mind*, listed 24 hashers who had attended every event between 1978 and 1986. (See next page). Although this list is interesting it is far from comprehensive as *Whorator* was missing.

By the mid-nineties '*Hares and Hounds*' listed only 5 survivors. These were *Philthy, Chee Bye, The Wolf, Whorator* and *The Penguin*. In fact Ron *The Penguin* Strachan had registered for every Interhash, but had missed Phuket because of a death in the family. This list omitted *Drainoil*. It is also possible that Ross *Opera* Singer and John Pollock (both Australians) might have been 'survivors' at this point.

By Goa in 2002 the number of survivors was down to a confirmed 5, these being:

· Frank Whorator Benfield (Australian)· Phil Philthy Chapman (Australian)

Allan Chee Bye Chee (Malaysian) Wolfgang The Wolf Gust (German)

Bob Drainoil Leonard (English).

*Whorator* was the next to drop out, failing to arrive in Goa even though he had registered as an Early Bird. He also opted out of Cardiff due to a severe case of Interhash burnout but returned to the Interhash fold in Chiang Mai 2006.

Just before Interhash 2010 *The Wolf* died of a heart attack while on the Frankfurt H3 trail, reducing the Survivors to 3:

Phil Philthy Chapman (Australian);-

.

Allan Chee Bye Chee (Malaysian);-

Bob Drainoil Leonard (English).

The death of *Chee Bye* left *Philthy* and *Drainoil* as the last hashers to have attended every Interhash. Their duel ended in a tie as both missed Goa in 2022.

*The Penguin* attended Goa, meaning he now equalled *Drainoil* and *Philthy* as the only hashers to have attended 21 out of the 22 Interhashes. There seems every possibility that he will attend Queenstown. If *Drainoil* and *Philthy* are absent again, *The Penguin* will become the hasher who has attended the most Interhashes.

# Hashers A to Z Letter

### Pour, Bob

Kuwait H3

His biggest contribution to hashing was designing the iconic **Kuwait H3** badge.

**Precious Ron Fuller Hamersley H3 (Australia)** Forty years and 800 runs with Hamersley.

### Pretty Young Thongs

Gasing Hill/PJ Animales (Malaysia)

Joined **Gasing Hill H3** in 2007 at the age of 18 and has reached 600 runs with them. In 2018 he join the **PJ Animales H3** and currently runs with both chapters. He was named *THONGS* with **Launcheston H3** where he was studying in 2008, this for wearing thongs after the run during winter. Later in 2018, he was renamed *Pretty Young Thongs* by the **PJ Animales**.

#### Prince Valiant, Sir Graeme Buntine Gold Coast (Australia)

Was on the very first **Gold Coast** hash and has clocked up nearly 1800 hashes since then placing him second on the Gold Coast run list. An engineer by trade, he avoided the committee for several years until becoming On-Sec in 1983. Having recovered from that experience he became GM in 1988. He has been a notable hash traveller, including 7 Interhashes since the 'Thriller in Manila'. At various time his mother, sister, wife and sons have all hashed. Was named after his first car, a Chrysler Valiant which apparently he still drives!

#### Prickhairyarse Simon Parker Whangarei H3 (New Zealand)

Godfather of the hash with 10 years as a GM and a record 1660 hashes. Daughter *Boobies* is now a keen hasher with the group.

### Prince Variant Robert Woods Boston H3 (USA)

Robert Woods has a long hash CV, including spells in Korea and Washington. He was founder of Boston and Madison kennels.

### Gordon Williams Bicester H3 (England)

Gordon *Prof* Williams was a distinguished scribe with **Bicester H3**, his publication being selected as trash of year in 1994, 1995 and 1996. He is even more famous for the ten years he spent as UK On-Sec his spell in charge being noted for an almost non-hash level of organization. Many thanks Prof!

### Ladies of Hong Kong


Hilary Prior happened to be in the Cricket Club on a night that the men's hash was there. Thinking it all looked jolly good fun, she organized a ladies run that attracted somewhere between five and seven girls.

### Prosser, Judy Jakarta Hash Scene (Indonesia)

In 1973-4 Judy joined the Jakarta men on a run from JIS. She continued to turn out regularly despite all their abusive and chauvinistic behaviour. Judy's presence on the Jakarta men's hash led to her being awarded the title Hash Pussy, a Hash





name she wore with pride. Subsequently, Carol Cooney, Jackie Cooney and Jackie Higgins all attended and refused to leave the Jakarta Hash. *Ed: Is it possible that but for the forming of the Harriettes this brave bunch of pioneers might have turned Jakarta into a mixed hash?* 

#### Puha Kris Persson Wellington H3

Kris *Puha* Persson was an expat from Sweden who became a regular runner with **Wellington H3**. He was murdered, along with his partner and fellow Hasher, Vanessa Johnson, while mountaineering in Bolivia in August 2005. *On on Puha*.

## Pumpkin Peter Benuare Hamersley H3 (Australasia)

Has completed 30 years and 500 hashes with Ham-

ersley. Famously became *Wanker of the Week* for starting the car of a fellow hasher who had left the keys in the ignition. He didn't notice it was in gear and very nearly run himself over.

## Pump Me Rita Wakim Beirut H3 (Lebanon)

*Pump Me* is an extremely fit and attractive Harriette who has been a central figure in Lebanese hashing for a number of years. When the Beirut hash split she was one of the few to run with both kennels, helping to lay the foundation for the eventual re-union of the two chapters.

## Pumps 'er Hard Kabul H3 (Afghanistan)

*Pumps 'er Hard* is one of a dozen Afghan regulars to have achieved a 100 Runs with **Kabul H3**. He took over the GM position in 2009.

## Purdie, Bill Bahrain H3

Bill Purdie acted as hash cash and then became the **Bahrain** GM from 1980-82. He continued to hash until leaving Bahrain in 1984. Described in the Bahrain newsletter as 'one of the oldest of the old timers realised how far past his peak he was when he failed to reach the starting line for the marathon'. Years later his daughter, Robyn *Throbbing Good* Purdie joined the Kuwait Hash unaware that she was from a distinguished hash family.

### Pussy Whipped James Millichip Brunei H4 and others

Pussy Whipped started hashing in August 1981 with Riyadh H3 and ran with them until April 1984. Returning to the UK, he was forced onto a Hash sabbatical due to the lack of a local kennel. In December 1987 James returned to Saudi Arabia, running with Yanbu H3 until January 1989. A second break was followed by a move to Brunei in 1992, where he became Hash Horn and Hare Raiser with KBH4 and GM and Hash Piss of the men's KBH3. He was also involved in the organizing of the first Brunei Nash Hash and ran with several other chapters. In 2004 Pussy Whipped co-founded Durian City H3 in Davao City, Philippines and hashed there until April 2005 when he moved to Egypt and joined Cairo H3. He was last heard of hashing regularly with Sakhalin H3 in the Russian Far East.

## Pussy Licker

## **Philippines Hash Scene**

Loved hashing particularly in the Philippines which he would return to whenever there was a hash opportunity. While in Kuwait, he went out for a pizza after his birthday party and managed to hit a police car escorting the Sultan. Now retired to England.



#### Queen of England, The Phil Davies Doha Night-Crawlers (Qatar)

Discovered hashing during his tours of work in the Far East (Japan/Taiwan/Hong Kong) before ending up in The Middle East. He was on the Mis-Management of the **Desert Hash** in Dubai (with whom



he was arrested for running in a red dress during Ramadan). Moved on to Doha where he co-founded the **Doha Nightcrawlers** with *Baldrick 2 Dogs*. Named *The Queen of England* because he is Welsh. On leaving the Nightcrawlers he was presented with a hash T-shirt saying "*The Queen is Dead*, *Long Live The King*" ..... only for everyone to discover that the actual Queen of England had died while they were out on the run. Owned by *Sweaty Yeti*. *Thanks to Dildo Dan* 

### Quick Drawers Rich Coats Okinawa H3 (Japan) and others

Quick Drawers has been hashing since 1977, starting with **China H3** in Taipei. With the US military moving away from Taiwan he transferred to Okinawa where he opened a hash at his air base. This group faded out after 40-50 runs but hashing on the island would continue from the marine base. In 1978 he attended the first official Interhash in Hong Kong. After Okinawa he spent 5 years helping to establish hashing in Panama before heading back to the States. Here he joined Mount Vernon H3, quickly becoming a member of the committee. One of his many claims to fame was being one of the last three hashers to have been present at every Americas Interhash. (He finally opted out of the 2019 hash cruise) He is also one of only three known hashers to have hashed in every US state. He estimates a life time total of around 2300 hashes.

A lifelong sportsman with a degree in Scottish history. At 40 he decided to try marathons and while jogging was 'kidnapped' by **TNT**, who were on their 13th but first official hash. Kept travelling the world to run half marathons and usually combined these trips with joining the local hash.


# Time-line of Hashing in London



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## **Great Kennels Seletar h3** The first year

Where do I begin, to tell the story of how great a love can be ... The sweet love story that is older than the sea. The simple truth about what the club brings to me ... Where do I start ?

Originating in 1938 (The Hash House Harriers, Selangor aka **Mother Hash**) and disrupted only during the World War 2, hashing arrived in Singapore in 1962 (Hash House Harriers Singapore aka Father Hash). **Father Hash** ran on Mondays and grew in membership. Singaporeans after getting a taste of Hashing in Malaysia etc., applied to join HHHS Monday Hash, but Monday Hash had closed its membership and were not admitting new members. Another version, or so I heard, was that as more Chinamen and Mamas joined, some became disgruntled by being bossed around by 'too many Kwailohs '.

Anyway, in either case, due to the increased popularity of hashing in Singapore, it was felt that there was room for another chapter to be formed, to run on a different day.

And so it began, one fine day in the spring of 1980, James *Winnie the Pooh* Sando, John *Brewer* Chew, Martin *Salami Mabok* Baptist, Ang *Smoothie* Chuan Seng, Avtar *Avgas* Singh and Paul *Deep Shit* Ang, were entertaining the GM of **P.J. Animals**, Alex *The Bear*, at the now closed Tivoli Coffee House. Somehow the conversation turned to the subject of forming another club (THE BEAR made this suggestion). There were mixed feelings at first, but by the time the evening ended, everyone was in general agreement.


Following that historic Tivoli meeting, things began to move fast. A Chapman meeting was convened in BREWER's Joo Chiat home, to form the interim committee and to decide on the club's name. The name Seletar was chosen as most of the founders worked in the Seletar neighbourhood.

A Pro Tem committee met on 26 May 1980 in Kingsford Bar (now also closed) to plan the details of an inaugural run. The run would be held on 21 June 1980, with Petaling Jaya, Sungei Ujong and Johor Bahru hashes invited as guests.

On the 21st June 1980 at approximately 1 pm, six hares set off to lay the run from their chosen run-site, Marsiling School. This was the largest number of hares in the history of Seletar as nothing was to be left to chance on our inaugural run.



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### The Inaugural Run

There were approximately 40 participants including 5 from **Sungai Ujong** and 3 from **PJ Animals.** The fun and games continued late into the night and carried on to Tivoli until 11.30 am, the next day.

Note that Seletar's first run on 21 June 1980 was a Saturday ! This was corrected from the 2nd run, held on Tuesday 1 July 1980 at Portsdown. Around 25 participated in this run hared by Paul *Polly Wooly* Ang and Avtar *Avgas* Singh.

The novice club was able to trash out a brief hareline (8 July run Seletar Camp, 15 July Choa Chu Kang Cemetery ). With around 20 runners usually turning up in the early days progress was steady. A committee was elected for the first time and our constitution passed.

#### The role of our Hash Brother Chapters

PJ Animals and Sungei Ujong were of great sig-

nificance as PJ's GM Alex *The Bear* was instrumental in getting the ball rolling and Seletar's constitution was based on Ujong's. James Sandosham sat as the Grand Master, later given the hash name ...." *Winnie the Pooh*. Finally, a year after SHHH was formed, we got our club logo.

Abtar Singh won the "Down Down "contest during the October 1982 Interhash in Jakarta, Indonesia ... hence he was given the name *Champ* we became "The World Champ Guzzlers " and our newsletter later called THE SELETAR GUZ-ZLER. Every year, **Seletar H3** and the **PJ Animales** and the **Sungei Ujong Hash House Harriers** join together for a Triangular Run, taking turns to host this fun filled event.

Interhash activities are so fun, that since 1987, SELETAR HHH joined Lion City, Johor Bahru and Tanjong Petri HHH for a Quadripartite Hash Rendezvous (QUAD RUN).

Our first AGM was held 4 April 1981 at Paradise Restaurant in Pasir Panjang.
